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INTRODUCTION

Have you ever sat in a church service, and heard the pastor say, "Take hold of God's promises! All of His promises are true and trustworthy! Cling to them! Memorize them!" I used to hear these things all the time, and would be completely confused. What promises?!

Once, I thought the Lord gave me a personal promise. I was completely excited by it. The idea filled me with enthuasism for the future. As the years passed, troubles came and made the promise look less and less likely... I held onto that promise as a source of comfort as I struggled with severe depression. Then, it looked like the promise would come true! Things started to look up, and I encouraged others to hold onto God because His promises are true. He wants to speak to us - just listen!

Seven months later, my world came crashing down. It became absolutely clear that my promise would never come true. Yet, I continued to hold onto it, like a light in a dark place. When people tried to remind me of reality, I in turn reminded them of my promise. Why would God lie to me? This is just a rough patch. Things will turn out in the end. If I start thinking that my promise won't come true, then I am doubting God Himself. Finally, after a particular incident, it became obvious that the promise would not be realized.

So, did I hear from God afterall? I don't know. I try not to dwell on it, because I trust God has good plans for me. Maybe I misunderstood what God meant. Maybe it was only true for a time. What I did learn through that spiritual confusion, though, was to hold fast onto God, and continually rely on Him for strength and comfort.

I also did the study you are about to do yourself. I made charts on each of God's promises, then tried to find some hidden meaning behind them. How does God give promises? Does He ever confirm them? How does He confirm them? People have so many opinions on this subject ("No, God doesn't give promises to people - that's why we have

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the Bible," "God confirms His promises through three ways: other peolple, Scripture, and the situation"). I wanted to know the answer to these questions for myself.

If you are going through a similar situation, take heart. The comfort does not come in having your promise fulfilled. Instead, the comfort comes by the Great Comforter, who has so many good things in store for you. Even though my promise was not fulfilled, I still trust God and I still believe He always keeps His word.

If you have never recieved a personal promise from the Lord, know that in His Word, He does give promises that apply to your life since you are a child of God. You will cover these promises in week five of the study. So, even if you don't think God has given you a promise, know that He already has - the promises are waiting for you in Scripture.


This study is not meant to be an exhaustive list of every promise in the Bible. Instead, you will observe some of the main promises throughout the Old and New Testaments, so you can understand (1) how God speaks to His people, and (2) how God confirms His promises. So, every time you think the Lord has forgotten you, lied to you, or generally doesn't keep His promises, just look at Israel and remember He has *always* kept His promises and He *always* will.

Goals For This Week:

- Understand the different aspects of God's promises.
- To consider the faith of Abraham, in order to encourage us to trust the Promiser,
 not a promise.

Our series on the promises of God begins with an examination of God's promises in His Word, by taking a look at each aspect of the promise. We will first do this through the book of Genesis, to see how the earliest men trusted and believed God wholeheartedly.

DAY ONE: THE EDENIC COVENANT & PROMISE OF FLOOD

There are two types of promises:

- Conditional: This promise is based upon the promisee's behavior. For example, if the Israelites follow God's commandments, they will be blessed. If they do not follow His commandments, they will be cursed. (Also called a covenant.)
- *Unconditional:* This promise will happen regardless of the promisee. For example, the promise of a Savior was fulfilled, no matter what the Israelites had or had not

done.

Normally, God will confirm His promise later to the promisee. He often does this through:

- Saying it again: In the case of the Abrahamic covenant, God often repeated this promise to confirm it was to come.
- *Using a symbol*: For Noah, God reconfirmed His promise to not flood the earth again by a rainbow. For the Israelites, the Passover was a symbol of God's protection through God's Egyptian plagues, as well as a forshadowing of Jesus Christ.
- Other people: This is why God often will send prophets, to bring God's Word to His people.
- Dreams: In some cases, God's people actually had dreams of His promises. Joseph in the Old Testament had two dreams, Daniel had several, etc. For Joseph in the New Testament, God's promise to Mary was confirmed through a dream.
- *A visit from an angel*: Abraham was also visited by an angel of the Lord to confirm God's previous promise to him.

Over the following days, you will be filling out charts to better understand God's promises. Each chart includes the following:

- Type: conditional, unconditional
- Who: To whom was the promise given
- Where: Where was the promise given

- When: What passage or verse was the promise given
- What: What was promised
- Confirmation: How did God confirm His promise later*
- Result: What ended up happening later*
- Response: Did the person believe the promise? Why or why not?*
- Wait Period: How long did it take for the promise to come true?*
- Lessons: What we learn from the promise (or what stood out to you)

*= Although we will give you the direct passage where the promise was given, for these answers you will need to look throughout your Bible. You might also need to consult commentaries, as some promises were fulfilled in modern times.

We have done the first chart for you on the Edenic Covenant, so you get the idea:

Туре:	Conditional (Adam was required to obey the terms of the covenant in order to not suffer the consequences of breaking
Who:	Adam (and Eve)
Where:	Garden of Eden
When:	Genesis 2:16-17
What:	God promises Adam life and blessing, only if Adam is obedient to God's command not to eat of the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil

Confirmation:	None, Satan tempts Adam to NOT believe it (Genesis 3:4-5)
Result:	Genesis 3:14-24, Adam breaks the covenant and is cursed (creates "Covenant of Redemption")
Response:	Disobedience
Wait Period:	Same day? Soon after? Hard to know.
Lessons:	(1) Establishes a repetitive pattern, of man's sin -> God's judgment of the sin -> God bestows grace and mercy by providing a way to redeem man and restore man's relationship with God (2) Sin always has consequences

FAITH IN GOD'S PROMISES

Hebrews speaks a lot on the subject of promises, but ultimately having faith in the Promiser, not the promise. Look over these passages:

Hebrews 6:13-20 (NLT): "For example, there was God's promise to Abraham. Since there was no one greater to swear by, God took an oath in his own name, saying: 'I will certainly bless you, and I will multiply your descendants beyond number.' Then Abraham waited patiently, and he received what God had promised.

Now when people take an oath, they call on someone greater than themselves to hold them to it. And without any question that oath is binding. God also bound himself with an oath, so that those who received the promise could be perfectly sure that he would never change his mind. So God has given both his promise and his oath. These two things are unchangeable because it is impossible for God to lie. Therefore, we who have fled to him for refuge can have great confidence as we hold to the hope that lies before us. This hope is a strong and trustworthy anchor for our souls. It leads us through the curtain into God's inner sanctuary. Jesus has already gone in there for us. He has become our eternal High Priest in the order of Melchizedek."

Hebrews 11:8-19 (NLT): "It was by faith that Abraham obeyed when God called him to leave home and go to another land that God would give him as his inheritance. He went without knowing where he was going. And even when he reached the land God promised him, he lived there

by faith—for he was like a foreigner, living in tents. And so did Isaac and Jacob, who inherited the same promise. Abraham was confidently looking forward to a city with eternal foundations, a city designed and built by God.

It was by faith that even Sarah was able to have a child, though she was barren and was too old. She believed that God would keep his promise. And so a whole nation came from this one man who was as good as dead—a nation with so many people that, like the stars in the sky and the sand on the seashore, there is no way to count them.

All these people died still believing what God had promised them. They did not receive what was promised, but they saw it all from a distance and welcomed it. They agreed that they were foreigners and nomads here on earth. Obviously people who say such things are looking forward to a country they can call their own. If they had longed for the country they came from, they could have gone back. But they were looking for a better place, a heavenly homeland. That is why God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

It was by faith that Abraham offered Isaac as a sacrifice when God was testing him. Abraham, who had received God's promises, was ready to sacrifice his only son, Isaac, even though God had told him, 'Isaac is the son through whom your descendants will be counted.' Abraham reasoned that if Isaac died, God was able to bring him back to life again. And in a sense, Abraham did receive his son back from the dead."
