

## [ENGAGE]

What stood out and impacted you from the message this weekend?

# [GROW]

What about this topic of our resources being connected to our heart and faith has been the most challenging for you? What has been the most surprising thing you've learned or heard? What has encouraged you most?

Read 2 Corinthians 9:6, 8, 10 & 11. The Apostle Paul lays out the "law of the harvest" in other words, when you plant a seed you will reap a harvest in time. When you apply this to our resources and finances, what does that mean for you personally?

When you realize that God is the Lord of the Harvest and that He brings provision and blessing... how does that affect the fear that we have around giving?

In the message, Pastor talked about these three parts to our giving. What do each of these mean to you and your situation and how could you take a step in each of these?

- Make giving a priority
- Intentionally decide on a plan
- Take the next step in giving

Read Luke 6:38. How does this challenge you personally in how you manage what God has given you? What does it tell you about the overwhelming generosity of our Heavenly Father?
