In regards to the security system we need to be careful how we leave the site each afternoon. Things get moved around and the sensors/cameras get blocked so I need everyone to be careful where we leave carts or equipment.

Crosshead repair work is being organized and as soon as I get the okay we will continue removing them.

Other work on the schedule is to finish removing the sand blast materials from the boiler and continue removing old flexi bolt plugs and wasted sleeves.

Measurements of the sleeves will be taken and drawings produced for bid packages.

Lastly I want to thank each and every one of you for all your hard work this past hot summer. Bob DeGroft reports that we have gone over 80,000 volunteer hours on this project. September saw more than 1600 hours logged which is a record number for us. I hope your dedication continues through the upcoming winter.

<u>Plans & Funding</u>: by Andy Rutkiewic CONTINUING EFFORTS An important meeting with ABQ city staff, Samitaur Constructs and Build ABQ was held at city hall on September 11th. NMSLRHS presented a comprehensive view of our future desired facilities at the Railyards. During these discussions both the Samitaur team and Build New Mexico strongly suggested that NMSLRHS consider moving to an interim location at the Railyards. Both of these issues were extensively considered. The Plans and Fundraising committee was charged with the task of developing a report on issues that are involved in an interim relocation. [SEE attached]. Legal council was consulted. A heavy transport company was contacted. On September 26th a meeting of the Downtown Action Team was held to start planning for a greatly expanded National Train Day in 2013. The event, being called the Rail Yard Regatta, would include heavy participation by the NMSLR&HRS to include the 2926, if possible. Other attendees included ABQ Cultural Affairs and MRCOG. The meeting was attended by Clem H., Steve B., Doyle C. and I. There will be further Railyards related meetings in October, to include the Rail Yards Advisory Board on October 8th and presentation by Samitaur Constructs of the first draft of the Rail Yards Master Plan on October 25th.

Albert Leffler and Steve B. met with Patrick Lopez, Executive Director of the Explora Museum, on September 26th to discuss possible options for closer cooperation between Explora and the Society.

Steve B., Doyle C. Pete A. and I attended the annual Teacher's Open House on September 26th at the Explora Museum. We were able to distribute information on our Education program September 29 th Open House to approximately 200 people.
