[CONNECT]

Do you like yard sales / garage sales? What is it about buying someone's else 'stuff' that brings us enjoyment? Especially when we already have too much as it is?

[ENGAGE]

BIG IDEA - Possessions will never give purpose, value, or worth the way Jesus can. What stood out to you from this weekend's message?

[GROW]

To prepare for this week's discussion, read Ecclesiastes 5:10-17, and discuss your first thoughts about what Solomon is communicating to his readers.

On a spiritual level, why is it part of our human nature to chase 'stuff' instead of chasing Jesus? Why do we have the tendency to pursue possession over God?

Earthly possessions will never satisfy you. What's going on in our hearts...when God's blessings aren't enough? Why can't we be grateful for what we DO possess rather than what we do NOT possess?

Discuss what it means to be "satisfied"? What are some of the feelings we get that are connected with the word "satisfaction"?

Earthly possessions won't be you peace? Read John 14:27 and discuss the "peace" that Jesus gives...

Earthly possessions have the ability to bring you harm. Recall the rich young ruler (Matthew 19:16-22) and see the spiritual "harm" it brought him. How can this affect us today?

You can't take it with you. Read Ecclesiastes 5:15-16. Knowing you can't take it with you, what legacy are you leaving here on earth? What generational legacy are you leaving that's going to go beyond this life and into the kingdom of Heaven?
