This is the moment when saved photos start asking real questions: timing, access, atmosphere, and how the day should actually feel.

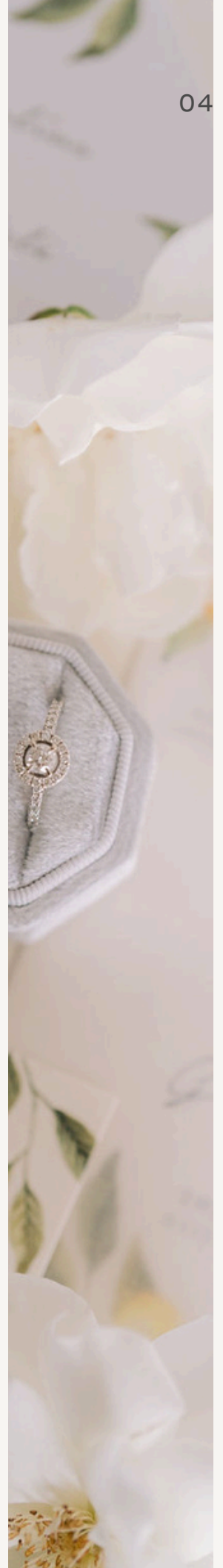
You're seeing it now — that planning isn't about the prettiest place, but about understanding how Italy works. Slowly. Beautifully. With rules no one explains.

Intimate wedding *&* ELOPEMENT

This isn't a guest count decision. It's an experience decision.

An elopement may be right for you if you want:

- just the two of you, free from expectations
- a day that moves slowly, with space to wander
- complete privacy
- a planning process that stays beautifully simple

Choose an intimate wedding if you want:

- share the day with your closest people
- end the evening with dinner, music, and dancing
- have your most important people witness the moment, so no one feels left out

They're both beautiful — they simply ask for different kinds of energy. The right choice is the one that lets you enjoy the day, not manage it.

If you imagine mostly the two of, you're likely leaning toward an elopement.

If you picture your parents, siblings, or best friends beside you, you're likely leaning toward an intimate wedding.

THE CEREMONY MYTH THAT CONFUSES COUPLES

Most couples think the ceremony is easy – in Italy, each type simply follows different rules.



A **Symbolic Ceremony** can take place almost anywhere — from a terrace to a hidden villa — without legal paperwork, but still with location permissions and fees.

A **Civil ceremony** follows town hall rules and happens only in approved venues - gardens, palaces, or historic spaces.

A **Church wedding** is possible for international couples, but it requires advance documents and approvals — and not every church is available to visitors..

This is often the moment couples think, *"Why does this suddenly feel harder than we expected?"* It isn't complicated — it's simply the Italian way.



Choosing a Venue That Feels Like You

*You don't need Italy's most famous view.
You need a place that feels right for you.*



With an intimate wedding, every detail is felt.

Some places look unreal online, but feel tight or rushed in real life. A place can be beautiful and still not be your place — and that doesn't mean you chose wrong.

You're not here to impress anyone.
You're here to feel everything.

THE QUESTIONS GOOGLE CAN'T ANSWER

In Italy, beauty is everywhere. Ease is not.



None of this appears in photos. Yet it's what decides whether your wedding feels calm... or like something you have to manage.

It usually begins with falling in love with how a place looks — then quietly wondering how the day will actually work.

Permits aren't just paperwork — they shape your moment: where and how long you stay, and whether it feels calm or rushed.

Then come the human moments.

- A road closes without notice.
- A place is "available", but not really.
- A yes becomes a soft maybe.
- Timing shifts depending on who you speak to and when.



Who Belongs in This – And Who Doesn't

Choosing vendors from abroad is one of the hardest parts.

You say yes based on photos, websites, messages and a feeling, without knowing how someone shows up when plans shift.

In Italy, it's not about the prettiest portfolio.

It's about who stays calm when timing changes, access is limited, or locations get complicated.

The right people handle these moments quietly. They:

- explain how things work — not just how they look,
- talk about timing, rules, and reality,
- stay steady when questions get specific,
- never rush your decisions.

Choosing too early — or without local — is where regret begins.

YOUR FIRST CLEAR STEP

Couples reach me at different moments. Some already know they want to elope. Others are still unsure — they simply know what they don't want.



This is the right time if:

- you feel more confused than excited
- you've saved many ideas but feel stuck
- you want the day to feel calm, not managed
- you don't want to learn the hard way

You don't need a plan yet. You only need to feel that doing this alone no longer makes sense.
