2018 A Year of Growth

2018 was another stellar year of growth for Fletcher Place Community Center. As I reflect on my second year at Fletcher Place, I am proudest of 1) increasing revenue and controlling expenses ending the year in the black; 2) implementing a successful year end campaign; 3) increasing enrollment in preschool while solidifying the Great Families 2020 as an integral part of the program and 4) the relationships I have been able to establish with the Board, staff, volunteers, and partners.

This year I was amazed by the preschool parents who, after years of struggle and trauma, decided to invest in themselves by going back to school even when they were scared. They did it for their children and their future. Their strength and bravery was an inspiration to me and a reminder of why I do this work.

I was also amazed by the generosity of supporters. Checks came in the mail in honor of parents who had passed, stock gifts that had been sold in the organization's name and a plethora of donations from hundreds of supporters. Those gifts were a blessing to the thousands we serve.

When I came to the organization in 2017, I was amazed by the volunteers and donors who are the backbone of Fletcher Place. Nothing that has happened over the last two years would be possible without you. Thank you. The growth of the organization will continue because of your support.

2018 Outcomes

- 18,170 breakfast and dinner hot meals were served.
- 1,221 families received over 30,366 meals through the Food Pantry.
- 1,507 shoppers made 9,485 visits to the Thrift Store.
- 3,286 hygiene kits provided to our homeless neighbors.
- **148 families** and their children received Christmas gifts.
- 2,831 volunteers provided 10,693 hours of volunteer service.
- 1 ton of fresh produce harvested and distributed from the Community Garden.

REACH Early Learning

For the 2018-19 school year, there are currently **23 students enrolled in preschool.**

- 36% are on vouchers and the other 64% are paying a reduced rate of between \$20-\$100 a week. 36% are paying \$20/week.
- 16 families have been referred to Southeast to participate in the Great Families 2020 Program working with education, employment and financial coaches.
- 6 parents became employed while their student was in preschool with us.
- 1 parent received their High School Equivalent (HSE) certificate and is now in EMT training.
- 2 additional parents currently in HSE classes

Did You Know You Can Help FPCC Break the Cycle of Poverty with Your Stock Gains?



If you are considering gifting to FPCC this year, we want to help. FPCC is set up as a 501c-3 tax deductible organization. This makes us eligible to receive both stocks and donations from donor advised funds, in addition to cash, check or charge of course. If you have a highly appreciated stock, rather than selling the stock, realizing the gain, and then gifting the proceeds, FPCC is set up to receive the stock directly. This should minimize your tax impact and maximize your charitable donation. For those donors that use a donor advised fund, we can provide your advisor with our EIN number so the donations can come directly from your Charitable Trust. For donors that have required minimum distributions, we can help you make qualified charitable distributions directly from your IRA. This helps meet your distribution requirement and reduces your tax exposure.
