
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Overview

Significant allergic reactions to immunizations are rare. Call our office or go to the Emergency Room for serious, life-threatening reactions.

Common Reactions

Mild redness at the injection site Mild soreness at site Low-grade fever (below 100.4 F) Mild body aches Feeding less (infants), mildly decreased appetite in children Sleeping more/tired



Serious Reactions

Pain with crying or screaming for 3 hours or more Seizures


Irritability

High fever (over 105 degrees Fahrenheit)

Large, hard, painful lump at the site of injection - growing larger (hematoma)

Entire limb swelling (leg or arm)

Serious allergic reaction - difficulty breathing
