## Lake Five

**Project Description:** Once the summer home of the Pfister-Vogel family, in 1959 this secluded lakeside property was donated to and continues to be carefully stewarded by the Midwest Jesuits. The main house and a series of cottages and other historical structures serve as a spiritual retreat center for the Jesuit community. Due to its ongoing care, the surrounding land remains an extremely valuable, high-quality ecosystem, and serves as an important buffer to protect the water quality and wildlife habitat associated with Lake Five.

**Why:** The Midwest Jesuits preserved this property and donated the development rights to:

- 1.) Continue their legacy of serving as good stewards of the land and water resources entrusted in their care.
- 2.) Serve as an example to our lake property owners within the community.
- **3.**) Safeguard the ecological health of Lake Five and its surrounding watershed by maintaining natural buffers and reducing runoff impacts.
- **4.)** Protect diverse habitats, including wetlands, forests, and open spaces that support native plant and wildlife species.

Size: Approximately 82-acres through donation of property owner
