Secondary Homeschool Procedures

Application process

- The application process is the same as for full-time students and consists of an initial tour, followed by the completion of the application process and a student interview
- 2. Fees related to tuition and courses can be found on the Tuition and Fees Schedule
- Homeschool students can take one to three courses.
- 4. Upon acceptance of the student as a homeschool-option student, the family will finalize their class selection upon the publishing of the enrolling year's class schedule and will receive contracts in July

Class Selection

- 1. Homeschool students need to choose a core course for their first course, and can select a secondary course for their second or third option
 - a. **Core Courses:** Bible, Science, Math, History (11-12 Dual Enrollment), English, 11th-grade Speech/PE
 - b. Secondary Courses: Foreign Language 9th-10th, PE 7th-10th & 12th
- 2. Add-ons with each course selected
 - a. Each course enrollment receives one activity period per week
 - Students can try out for Extracurriculars (Soccer, Basketball, Baseball, Softball, Play, Non-Elective Fine Arts)
 - c. Chapel and Lunch attendance are available based on the course schedule
 - i. Chapel is not required, but if a student has a class before and after, then they also need to go to chapel
- 3. Homeschool students may attend class (homeroom) parties, enrolled-course field trips, and IOWA testing

Guidelines

- If the student signs up for a first-hour class, they are required to attend homeroom and should be placed on a homeroom roster.
- 2. If a student is on campus during a time they are not taking a course, they will be assigned to a classroom and placed on that teacher's roster. (For safety reasons, students should not be sitting outside the office regularly.)
