
For the Son of Man came to seek and save those who are lost. Luke 19:10 (NLT)

- 2. Verse 2 says that the Shepherd brings me to places of rest and leads me to places of peace. How have you seen Him do that in your life? How do we get here when life seems stressful and chaotic?
- 3. Where does your strength need renewing right now?
- 4. Share a time you were in a dark valley. Did you sense God's presence, or did you feel alone and isolated? What is his "rod and staff" and how does that protect and comfort us?
- 5. Verse 5 acknowledges that we do have enemies. How do you find nourishment and fulfillment in the midst of enemy territory? What is God's promise in these difficult times?
- 6. When you think of heaven and living in the "house of the Lord forever", how does it make you feel? Anxious, excited, etc? What do you think the Good Shepherd wants you to experience?

Read through Psalm 23 slowly together as a group. What is one phrase that you want to take with you throughout the coming season?
