2020s Trend: NEUTRAL AND ALL-WHITE COLOR PALETTES

In terms of color palette, farmhouse style has been all about neutrals or all-whites. One of the draws for this look is the ability to add any color to your palette throughout the year. But while all whites and neutrals can look stunning if done well, they don’t provide much contrast. “I am happy to see the trend of all-white kitchens go,” says designer Holly Thompson of Holly Thompson Homes. “In order to do an all-white kitchen well, it needs to have dimension and layering. People were obsessed with copying a look and often used cheap finishes to get it. This made masses of homeowners end up with cookie-cutter kitchens unable to stand the test of time.”
