- 15. How will a belief in the Means of Grace (the gospel in Word and Sacrament) both comfort and spur on the Christian who wants to continue the chain disciples?
- 16. Based on 2 Timothy 2:2, describe in your own words the biblical model of Chains of Disciples.

- 17. Whom does the "chain of disciples" include? Are highly-trained pastors and missionaries the only people God wants to share the Gospel with others? How might it be beneficial for Christians who are not pastors to become disciples sharing God's word?
- 18. How might a commitment to the idea of Chains of Disciples change the way a church leader spends his time and the way he speaks?
