<u>Opening Remarks</u>: Let's Begin with the sign of the cross: We come together in the presence of our Creator God, and our Redeemer, and our Sanctifier.

<u>Story of Mary of Magdala:</u> On July 22, 2016, Pope Francis proclaimed that day a memorial of St. Mary Magdalene to a feast on the church's liturgical calendar. He referred to her as a "true and authentic evangelizer..." The Vatican announced that the day is a call for all Christians to "reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the new evangelization and the greatness of the mystery of divine mercy."¹

Now let us pray. We gather here today to remember and honor many of the wisdom figures in our history; mothers, daughters; grandmothers, aunts, sisters, colleagues and friends. As well as our modern day SHEroes who inspire us and encourage us on our journeys. We give thanks for their example and for their witness. We can be thankful that today there are many female theologians and biblical scholars (who alongside their brothers) are helping us appreciate how much God loves us and we recognize that God works through us to reach out to our world.

We call on the holy women who went before us, channels of Your Word in testaments old and new, to intercede for us so that we might be given the grace to become what they have been for the honor and glory of God.

Theologians have debunked the false myths about St. Mary Magdalene as a sinner and reclaimed her for what she truly was, the Apostle to the Apostles. As three of the four Gospels record, she was indeed the first witness to the Resurrection, and so then, for those fateful moments... hours, immediately thereafter, there's a deep sense in which Mary Magdalene WAS the Church. Let us celebrate that God chose a woman to be the first person who knew the Resurrection story and could proclaim it to the rest of the world.

ALL: May You watch over and keep all your people, these women and all who love them, with your care, gracious God. Consecrate this day for your glory. In the name of the Triune God, the one who parents us and creates us, who redeems us, and empowers us forever. Amen.

<u>Scripture Readings</u>: God of light and life, You are the source of all that is good in our lives. We give you thanks for Jesus, the Word made flesh, who sent women to tell the Gospel: St. Mary Magdalene, as well as Martha the Samaritan woman, and so many others. We give you thanks for the gift of the Holy Spirit, that bold Wisdom-Spirit who impels us today to proclaim your good news of peace and justice in our homes, communities and the world. **ALL: Amen**
