



Dance Dress Code for Women

The Why

Dresses must be appropriate and be a representation of who you are as a beloved, beautiful daughter of the King. You want your beautiful dress to reflect your beauty. Please pick something that makes you feel gorgeous because that is a reality! Remember, because of who you are, you don't need to draw attention to yourself because you already have the acceptance and admiration of a loving God. As the movie "The Secret Life of Walter Mitty" says, "Beautiful things don't ask for attention" and you, for a fact, are beautiful!

We do realize that Christians have different standards of modesty, and it is ultimately between the person and the Holy Spirit. However, school dances are under the jurisdiction of LC and we have a standard and guideline for all school dances. The following are the standards for women's apparel for all LC dances. God calls us to respect whoever is placed in leadership, so we are asking you to respect what God has called us to put in place. We hope you would see that everything school leadership puts in place is an attempt to pursue your good, and that your teachers are trying their best to love you, protect you, and promote the ways that lead to Life.

The Standard

- Your dress needs to have some sort of strap or sleeve around your arms or neck (one shoulder dresses are permitted).
- We want to avoid completely open backs, please have your dress cover at least half your back. It should cover your bra.
- The highest part of your slits need to be at least a half inch lower than fingertip length.
- Cut outs in your dress must have colored mesh or fabric covering if it is in an area that should be covered.
- Be aware of how tight your dress is. We do not want any skin tight dresses.
- Your dress should not reveal your cleavage.
- Think elegant, beautiful, gorgeous, and full of decorum.

We believe that because each of us is uniquely, fearfully, and wonderfully made, each dress will look different on each person. If you think you have a dress that is modest but aren't sure if it meets the guidelines, feel free to send pictures or bring it in to school to confirm its approval.

Students arriving to dances wearing dresses outside of these guidelines risk being asked to leave the dance.
