When you will do family formals and how many people you are including can change your wedding day timeline a lot. Many couples who do a first look choose to take immediate family formals before the ceremony. Most of those people are already at the venue, and it frees up time after the ceremony to enjoy cocktail hour, or spend a little alone time together.

Keep in mind, choosing this option doesn't mean you can't get pictures with your extended family - cousins, or favorite aunt - instead those can be taken during the reception as a less formal picture if you'd like.

Others who choose to do it first look may still decide to take family portraits after the ceremony. This is an especially good option if you want formal pictures of extended family, or if you know your entire family will not be present at the venue before the ceremony.

If you are not doing a first look, or want formal extended family portaits, you will definitely want to take family portraits after the ceremony, during cocktail hour, to make sure you and your new spouse can both be in the pictures.

Keep in mind that if you have a large extended family it can take quite a while to get all of those portraits done. We recommend planning at least five minutes per extended family combination. For very large groups of more than 20 it can take even longer.

Other things you may want to add to your timeline

There are many other things that could affect your wedding day timeline. Here are a few things to keep in mind. Try to add a few minutes during those parts of the day.

bride and groom exchange gifts/letters

father-daughter first look

bustle bride's dress

travel times between venues

lunch

greeting guests

How long to plan for pictures

45-60 minutes Details (dress, bouquet, invitations, jewelry, etc.)

45-60 minutes Bridal prep (hair and makeup, robe shot, putting dress on)

30-60 minutes First look/Bride and groom portraits (before the ceremony)

20-40 minutes "Just Married" portraits of bride and groom (after the ceremony)

30-40 minutes Bridal party

20-40 minutes Family formals
