The overall average cost associated with each lonely person in Australia is \$1.565 a year



1.PRESENTATIONS	We deliver interactive and engaging presentations tailored to community specific needs - duration 1 hour. For larger schools, presentations are split - 1x Primary School presentation and 1x Secondary School presentation.	
2. RESOURCES	Following the presentations we provide stage-based resources to staff to support their students and continue learnings.	
3. VOLUNTEERING	On completion of the program students and staff are provided the opportunity to participate in our volunteer program, The Letterbox Project.
