What do you believe is the main lesson in the parable? Don't compare your blessings to others? Focus on your mission and not that of your brothers? We serve a generous God who gives more than we deserve? What lesson stands out to you the most?

Talk about the dangers of comparison? Why is this such a harmful trait in the life of a believer? Why do we struggle with this so much?

God gives blessings because he loves us. Do you ever struggle with the idea that God's blessings, love or favor are based on our works? What do you do to combat or overcome that thought process?

God does not owe you anything. That's a bold statement and can be a little hard to swallow. What's your opinion of this? Is it hard for you to buy into this philosophy?

[LEAD (YOURSELF)]

Sometime this week, take an inventory of your mindset when it comes to your relationship with God. Is comparison an issue for you? Do you believe that you must work for God's blessing and favor. How do you respond when someone else is blessed, even though you feel, they haven't earned it. Ask God to examine your heart and mind and to bring to light anything that needs attention and tweaking.
