DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

CONNECT

Has someone ever given you a promise that sounded absolutely horrible in the beginning, but then turned out to be good in the end? (ex. "I promise this roller coaster is going to make you sick, but you're going to have a blast!")

ENGAGE

What was one thing that really got your attention from the weekend's message about how Jesus promised us "tribulation"... followed by a promised to "take heart..." because He has already overcome it?

GROW

1. In what areas of your life are you currently struggling to experience peace? What would it look like to invite Jesus into that space?
2. How does Jesus' statement "I have overcome the world" influence the way you face daily challenges or spiritual battles?
3. Have you ever experienced a situation that felt hopeless at the time, but later became a place of growth or healing? What changed?
4. What does it mean to live from victory rather than for victory, and how does that mindset shift your faith walk?
5. What steps can you take this week to "prepare for trouble," as suggested in the message, while still walking in peace and hope?

CHALLENGE

- **REMAIN** in Christ daily – The BEST way to stay connected to peace, to the Prince of Peace, is to stay close to Him. The further away you begin to drift, the less peace you'll experience in your life. That's a promise I can give to you.
- **PREPARE** for trouble – Since we know it's going to come as Jesus promised, keep your spiritual guard up. (1 Peter 5:8; Eph. 6)
- **LIVE** courageously - Knowing Jesus has already overcome.

Let me encourage you... stay close to Jesus. Remain in His presence through reading scripture, talking with Him, spending quiet time just listening, taking a walk in nature, listening to worship music... just to name a few.
