

#### YOU ARE CREATING CHANGE.

Your donations have enabled us to expand our support for survivors through local partners in Laos and Cambodia! For the past decade, each of these local partners has provided safety, education and job training to survivors of human trafficking and those at risk of exploitation. We are grateful to be supporting these new partners so that they can continue to do such impactful work.

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to create various challenges across our project partners. In Canada, our in-person private screenings of *The Twelve Thousand* film have been forced to pause throughout the rest of the year, though we will be launching the film digitally in early Fall. We will also be holding our first summer fundraising event Move For Freedom on August 15th.

In Nepal, our local partner has persevered through over 90 days of government lockdown and the country is experiencing major food shortages. Your donations have helped us to provide food for the 150 children in our five safe homes as well as meet the urgent nutritional needs in surrounding communities.

Our vision for the next 3-5 years includes expanding the capacity and sustainability of our three local partners in Nepal, Laos and Cambodia. We're thankful for the trustworthy and collaborative relationship we have with the national leaders overseeing our partner projects and we look forward to continuing to support their work!

In order to support the operations of our three international projects and our operations in Canada we need to fundraise an annual budget of \$1.3 - \$1.5 million. Additionally, we are continuing to fundraise towards the goal of purchasing land and building new safe home facilities in Nepal through *The Twelve Thousand* film campaign, which we will be re-launching digitally due to limits on group gatherings. The new facilities will help us increase our capacity to care for rescued survivors, increase project stability and sustainability and create opportunities for future training and growth throughout Asia.
