Rev. Jessi to Retire at End of Year

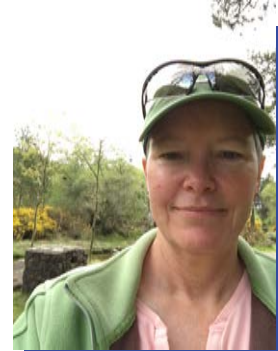

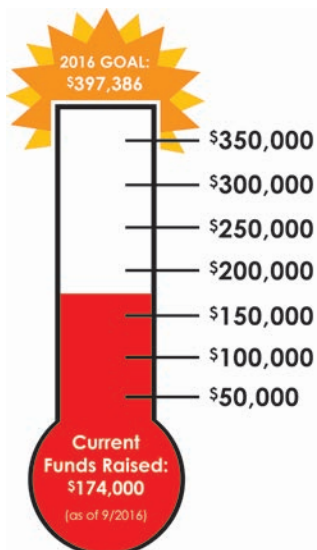

It's Personal...

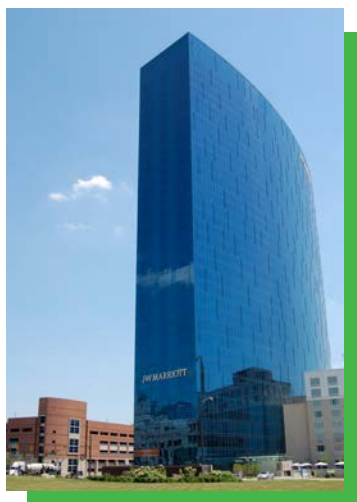
Feminine hygiene products are always hard to come by for the women that use our services. With the SNAP Program in Indiana, feminine hygiene products cannot be purchased. This means a lot of women have to sacrifice the small amount of income they have towards these products and sacrifice other needs or just go without. Feminine hygiene products are not something to go without if you are going to school or work or anywhere else. Recently, thanks to Walmart, we received a large donation of four flats full of these important products!

The first day we received them, a woman was brought to tears at our food pantry when she realized she could have a package of pads with her food order. She then went on to tell our food pantry manager that she had to decide between diapers for her baby or pads for herself that month. She chose buying diapers and just was not sure what she was going to do. It is amazing how one box can make a huge difference in a woman's life. Even with this amazing donation, we are still in need of steady donations each month so we don't run out. All it takes is one small donation to change one woman's life.

Fletcher Place Annual Dinner @ JW Marriott

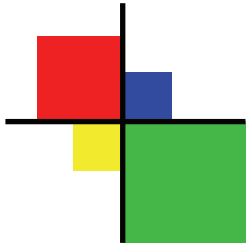
