Jessica thank you so much for joining me today on the love light stories podcast. It is just a pleasure to finally meet you and get to hear a little bit about your story I know um I can't imagine it must have been in the moment.

What you said sixteen years ago that yeah that it um was a really really hard thing to walk through. I'm just going to let you start by sharing a little bit about what happened and we can go from there.

Yeah, Thanks so much for having me, like such an honor. I was a college freshman and I think like most college freshmen, you know you're at a season where it's this fresh start and you have your whole world and life ahead of you and while I didn't know exactly what my plans are going to be for the future I I knew I was going to do something right? I was focused I was a college freshman. Was there on scholarship I was I was ready to do big things and it was until one Friday night My best friend and I who I had known since I was 5 years old went out one Friday night and we never made it home 5 minutes from her dorm room. Less than a mile from home. There was an accident and my car spun off the interstate rolled into a tree and Laura was killed on impact and I was inches from my own death The only reason I'm talking to you today is because i'm. So short and when the roof caved-in, I was severely injured but was able to make it out. Um, you know in a matter of moments I went from worrying about midterms and what I was going to major in and writing my next paper to am I going to make it out of this drama unit like. Am I going to be able to walk again and when I found out that my friend who I thought was a stranger next to me at the moment did not make it out of the car like how would I ever go another day without her. How would I ever. Look in the mirror again or wash the blood off my hands they saw everything was a question and there were no answers to be found.

What was it like...did you wake up in the car or was your first moment waking up in the icu unit? What was that like?

You know for most people who have a severe traumatic experience like that You don't remember most of it for some reason I do and I woke up in the car right after the accident. I could see the cars speeding past on the interstate and and nobody was stopping I was there as they cut me out of the car. Um, like I was awake through all of this and once they got to me they kept me awake because I had a very very bad head injury. Um, and I had to stay awake through that and none stitches to reattach my ear and close the gash on my head and I found out that I that Laura was in my car when I was in the trauma center and I found out that she didn't make it. I overheard the officer telling my mother he was getting ready to explain to her. You know that he had done a forcible blood draw on me and as he begins to tell her about this paperwork right by my bed I heard him say the words because this was a fatality.

And it was like instantly all the dots were connected. She was the one who'd been in my passenger seat. He said she was the fatality. She didn't make it and I crumbled I was hysterical like trying to pull the ivs out of my arm screaming hysterically you know. Not Laura I killed my best friend you know, just hysterical. Um, and you go to this place of just like out of body moment just losing it and then an instant shock.

Obviously they they came and they medicated me and they restrained me because I was now at risk to myself. Um, but it was almost like this Cloud came over me and I remember laying there lifelessly for 4 hours as they administered the stitches and it was just like. Nothing was real. None of these people moving around. Nothing was real I was just in this cloud at this point and the the way that we grieve and deal with traumatic experiences as humans is very strange and doesn't feel sometimes like there's much rhyme or reason. But you know moments of complete denial to moments when I would pick up the phone and try to call her and then it would hit me like a ton of bricks that she'll never answer that phone and and you know reality hits and hysterical Again. It was just this roller coaster of me. My body trying to process what it could while my body was still trying to block out so much because I couldn't I was trying to physically heal. Let alone trying to emotionally even Grasp. What was going on that was going to take some time.

Right? Your body was almost protecting itself from what it couldn't handle the overwhelm and not to mention you were in the icu trying to heal physically as Well…and probably that affects your ability to think and and grieve and all that too. I can't imagine you were just at your absolute max physically emotionally all of that. I did a little research and stuff too on your story and it seems as though her parents were pretty upset as well like what was that like to deal with a miss

your own personal grief but also trying to deal with you know her parents who of course loved her so much too were so upset over it.

It was not an amazing time. I had known Laura since I was five years old we'd gone to school together since kindergarten and in the weeks prior to this accident I was actually...I helped with their with her younger sister. So I'd be at they were both teachers and I'd go to their house every morning at six o'clock what they had to leave to go to school to work for them and I would take her younger sister to school and drop her off like I had a key to the House. We were very very close. And so in this moment to not just lose her but to lose every connection to her was was hard but I had I should say they had have let's be honest I have. Ah, very very very extreme case of survivor's guilt. So for me, there was this constant juggle of like the human emotions of wanting to be upset and sad and angry and not understanding why other people feel the way they do or what they're going through.

In that exact moment being consumed with guilt and feeling like of course they should not want. It's talked to me of course this and being incredibly understanding of that and I looking back on and and even in that moment I don't know how it's so young I was eighteen years old when this happened um. You know we always say like oh I could never do this I could never do that I would never handle something like this like you truly have no idea how you will handle something until it happens to you and I could have never told you that should a situation should an accident like this happen to me that I would go out and speak to hundreds of none of people and. And to share this story in a way that hurts so much but helps at the same time I would have told you absolutely not I will go hide in my little hole and not do that. Um, but you truly you don't know how you're going to handle something until you're in the thick of it and. As much as I could say I would never do that if you know my child was in a situation like that I could never never you know detach or disown or act as if there was no relationship to this person but we don't know and everybody handles things in their own way.

they were to ever come around and want to have a relationship with me that I would be here with open arms if they ever wanted to come around and have a conversation even if it was just to get out Anger or frustration that I would be here that I would happily. You know, be that for them. But I can't spend my days waiting for someone else's timeline that doesn't do any good for anyone.

But that blows my mind constantly though like looking backwards now as an adult like eighteen year olds are babies! But so much of my decision making during that season came from a place of knowing that I was at peak conflict within myself within my body with others with the court with everything that I knew that I was at the peak and it would not always be like that. So with every decision that I made for anything I always try to think about okay, in 10 years how am I going to feel about this decision and that I did not make that decision on my that on my own day was I had a therapist. My parents were very helpful I had legal counsel. Had plenty of people in my corner helping me um, but helping me get outside of the moment that I was in because even though I was navigating that season I wanted to make moves and decisions and impact based on the long term so I would ask myself like in 10 years am I going to regret that I went out and spoke because people didn't want me speaking about this I when I started speaking to youth because I couldn't fix this right like I could not change anything that had happened I could not bring her back. I could not fix it and I'm a fixer so I started speaking to prevent others from repeating my mistake to keep Laura's memory alive and to maybe just maybe find a reason to wake up every morning but a lot of people did not want me speaking they thought I was doing it for the wrong reasons. I like they just they wanted me to face play. It. They wanted me to give up and a lot of days I was like well maybe they're right? Maybe I shouldn't maybe I like should not be doing this. This is not for me and I would get to that place where I would think in None ears am I gonna look back and wish I had done it instead because I can't get the time back and I'm never gonna be as relatable as I am right now 1 year older than you know, high school seniors which is like my prime speaking audience i's like I'm never gonna be as relatable as I am right now. Um, and that. Decision making like that perspective of looking at things from like how will I feel about this when this season and not that it's going to ever pass but like on the other side of this help me navigate it in the difficult times.

So in this season when it comes to the criticism like the biggest thing you need to understand to really grasp that moment is I was facing a 10.5-13 prison sentence on the table. My case was very publicized too while I was going through this. It was in all the newspapers it was on international media outlets like it was everywhere and it's not because anything was special about our story. This story happens every single day. What was different about our story is that I, the person who was responsible for this, was out there admitting that they were wrong and that's not something that happens every day so people did not know how to receive that. They immediately assume the worst of, oh she is out here talking because she wants sympathy. She's out here talking because she's trying to get out of her sentence. She's out here trying to make people think Xy and Z. Which is a little wild to me because my lawyer definitely did not want me going out and saying I did this. I'm doing the exact opposite of what I should have been doing, right? None of that makes sense when we look at it logically, but this was a very emotionally charged thing.

So I don't know people just could not wrap their mind around the fact that I was just trying to make it right. It all started because I was in therapy and I was getting frustrated, I was diagnosed with ptsd and Survivor's guilt and a whole slew of colorful things and I was getting really frustrated because I'm like I don't want to talk about this anymore. I don't want to talk in therapy. I'd be like I don't want to talk to you about this. It's not changing anything. Um and that's where speaking came from for me. I was like, if talking about it is what it takes to heal I'm going to talk to somebody who it's actually going to benefit because at that time when I was dealing with such severe survivor's guilt, helping myself was not enough. I had zero motivation to help myself. But if I could help someone else that might chip away that guilt a little bit and so for me going out there and being able to maybe prevent somebody else from repeating our mistakes, keeping Laura's memory alive, feeling like her life wasn't lost in vain...is you know that for me was why I was doing this but to people who could not see that perspective all they saw was she's trying to get out of prison like she's trying to sway the court and like that couldn't have been anything further from my reality.

and forgetting about it 10 minutes later. we're doing so much harm by being so negative. Because for you, it was deeply personal. This is your life and it just always is going to be but the work that you are doing to try to make good and light come out of something that was very dark. In that person's perspective they were twisting it and taking it in the wrong wrong direction and I don't know why we do that as human beings...I I don't know...I think maybe just because negativity is so much easier than positivity. We think so many negative thoughts in a day compared to positive ones and perhaps we just feel like people are ill-motivated.

No flight in me like I it does do not exist I have no quit in me and um and so the only thing I knew was to keep going and like what are their options were there and I don't know I just...I don't I don't have any quit. Ha!
