EXPLORE GOD'S WORD

What is your favorite time of day? Do you enjoy the morning with a tasty breakfast and listening to the birds sing? Do you enjoy the bright sunshine and warmth of the afternoon? Do you love watching the sunset or seeing the stars at night? God fills the entire day with wonder.

Dusk is an excellent time to explore God's creation. The dusk hour is right after the sun sets when there is still a glow of sunshine in the sky but not very much light. Many creatures are active at this time. And there are some things in nature that you can only see or hear at this time of day.

Psalm 113:3 says, "From the rising of the sun to the place where it sets, the name of the LORD is to be praised." The sun travels across the sky each day, rising in the east and setting in the west. When it is dark where you live, it is light on the opposite side of earth. God should be praised all across the earth and at every hour. This happens as more people all around the world hear about God, and it also happens as God's creation in nature reflects His beauty and goodness like a mirror. As you searched for God's wonders at dusk, you were worshiping God! By looking for and appreciating all He has made, our thoughts turn to God. Thank Him for what you found on your Dusk Scavenger Hunt. Thank Him for specific things you saw, heard, smelled, and felt.

Along with perhaps a cool breeze or drop in temperature, did you feel a sense of awe and wonder in your spirit? Thank God for that, too.
