SET IN STONE

Megan Schultz finds timeless charm in Jamb's Mereworth Mantel

The Tastemaker: Endlessly inspired by the character and charm of older homes, Megan Schultz, interior designer with Stone House Collective based outside of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, deftly balances vintage and modern in her design approach. She creates interiors that feel collected, authentic, and comfortably lived in.

The Object: Taking cues from the historic homes she loves, Schultz finds the Mereworth Mantel from U.K. brand Jamb makes a lasting statement. Made of high-quality marble with soft grays, tobacco, purple, and ivory tones that beautifully complement the "eared" 18th-century form of the mantel, the piece is quintessential Jamb; the company is renowned for its more than 25 years of selecting antique and reproduction fireplaces, lighting, and furniture. Each piece in their London workshop is hand-finished to ensure timeless quality and character.

In Her Words: "For centuries fireplaces have been the heart of the home. While we no longer rely on them as our primary heat source or a way to cook, they still shape the way a room feels and how people gather," she says. "A fireplace anchors a space, giving it a sense of intention and warmth even when the fire isn't lit. The mantel introduces an instant focal point, offering a natural stage for seasonal styling that keeps a room feeling adaptable, personal, and refreshed throughout the year. This marble mantel from Jamb is dramatic yet timeless—a piece destined to steal the show in any room."
