SOME big news for the Brian Flannery-backed miner Diatreme Resources with the company signing a memorandum of understanding with Ports North for the export of its silica sand via Cape Flattery Port. Diatreme chief executive Neil McIntyre says it was another key milestone for Diatreme as it worked to unlock the export market. The company's mine near Cooktown aims to supply hig-quality premiumgrade silica and mineral sands for use in global solar panels and ceramics markets.
