Rhino 911 provides emergency helicopter rescue to rhinos injured or orphaned due to poaching and other injuries and has responded to over 140 calls for help since its inception. When you join Rhino 911 on a horn trimming experience, you are not just saving the life of one animal but also investing in a future for rhinos all across Africa.



David Shepherd Wildlife Foundation (DSWF) is a conservation charity funding key projects across Africa and Asia. They help support wildlife crime and rangers on the front lines of poaching, community education programmes and wildlife projects that rescue, rehabilitate and return animals back to the wild.



Established in Zambia in 2008, Game Rangers International (GRI) is a non-profit organisation that works in close partnership with the Department of National Parks and Wildlife (DNPW) to empower rangers and local communities to conserve nature. They embrace a holistic approach to conservation across three thematic areas; resource protection, community outreach and wildlife rescue.



Mabel is a sustainable feminine hygiene initiative teaching girls and women in rural communities how to sew their own reusable period kits. The kits can last up to three years, which not only helps many low-income families financially but also reduces waste in landfills. Mabel also teaches menstrual lessons to educate woman and girls on the importance of feminine hygiene safety.

BOTSWANA

Botswana is blessed with some of the most beautiful wildlife locations on the continent of Africa, including the lush Okavango Delta, the vast Kalahari Desert, and the biologically diverse Chobe National Park, home to some of the largest families of elephants in Africa.

Located in the central part of Southern Africa, Botswana's amazing ecosystems combine deserts with wetlands, leading to fantastic game viewing opportunities. With water at the heart of most activities here, bird viewing is epic, the Delta plains offer stunning lion sightings and the waterways provide close encounters with huge herds of elephants, all of which make Botswana a top destination for wildlife enthusiasts and photographers.

1 Glide Through the Delta

One of the best ways to gain a unique perspective of the Okavango Delta, as well as insight into the culture of the indigenous San people, to gliding through it's stunning reed-fringed waterways in a traditional canoe called a mokoro. You will get to see a variety of birds, hippos and crocodiles, as your expert guide transports you along the delta in search of wildlife.



2 The Road Less Travelled

While Botswana is known for the waterways of the Okavango Delta and the plains of the Kalahari, the lesser known Chobe National Park offers guests a more intimate safari experience. Chobe is also home to the highest concentration of elephants on the African continent, making it a prefect location for those looking for great photography opportunities.



3 Take a Walk on the Wild Side

Heading out into the desert with a Bushman is an experience you will never forget. The Sans people of the Kalahari are the oldest inhabitants of Southern Africa, and while the modern world is changing life for these people, their vast knowledge of living in the Kalahari is still being passed down through the generations. This walk is a fantastic education for any guest.

DumaTau, "roar of the lion", is located on the banks of the Chobe with views stretching across Linyanti Wildlife Reserve. Here, you can see the large herds of elephants and beautiful birdlife. Enjoy the opportunity to spend the night on a luxurious star bed, giving you a front row seat to wild Botswana.

DAY 4 - 6

Take a short fly to your next camp, Little Vumbura in the northern area of the Okavango Delta. Situated on a beautiful island in a private concession, this is an ideal location for exploring this special ecosystem by water. In between activities, you can relax in the plunge pool overlooking the floodplain.

DAY 7 - 10

Complete your stay at one of the most beautiful and eco-friendly lodges in Africa, Mombo. The "Place of Plenty" allows you to immerse yourself in wildlife, right from your bedroom deck. Its location is the perfect combination of sustainability and luxury, as well as boasting enormous concentrations of plains game and predators.



After the seasonal rains to the north, the water flows into Botswana, making April through to October a great time to visit. Check out the Carmine bee-eaters in September & October.

CANADA



Canada is an untouched wilderness waiting to be discovered. A focus on the west coast of British Columbia and its incredible temperate rainforest offers the ultimate holiday combination of city break and wild exploration.

The ever-changing weather of this northern rainforest makes for a lush landscape that covers approximately 32,000 km². After the icy cold winter, the forests and coasts start to explode with new life and the estuaries entice the grizzly bears with their feasts of fish.

Middle to late summer sees the start of the salmon spawning season. Marvel at the bears swiping and clawing at the salmon as they furiously fight to migrate upstream. The salmon run is an unmissable event for any wildlife enthusiast.

FEATURED EXPERIENCES

1 Bear Encounters

Experience the salmon run and watch grizzly bears gather to fish in the Great Bear Rainforest. Enjoy a bear safari from May to October and find yourself in the Canadian wilderness after an exciting seaplane ride from Port Hardy. Each season offers unique grizzly bear viewing opportunities, from springtime cubs to the salmon river feast in September.



2 The Peak of Vancouver

No matter the season, there is something for everyone at Grouse Mountain, from ziplining and aerial mountain ropes in the summer to ice skating and snowshoeing in the winter, as well as lumberjack shows and grizzly bear visits. For a challenge, try the Grouse Grind, a 1.8-mile trail featuring 2,830 stairs that takes you 2,800 feet up the mountain. Or, just take the gondola up for amazing views of the city and the ocean.



3 Whale Tales

Go in search of orcas and humpback whales in the straits between the Canadian mainland and Vancouver Island. Set sail into the waters with your local guide or in your own kayak to look for the resident orcas populations, as well as the opportunity to see the humpback whales between June and September.

DAY 1 - 3

Explore the international city of Vancouver while discovering its culture and history, explore the beautiful parks and stop at the famous Gastown Steam Clock. Travel by plane to Port Hardy, to catch a seaplane flight to Great Bear Lodge. This is a perfect habitat for grizzly bears, from where you will spend your days searching for the them by boat.

In between boat safaris, relax with great food and wonderful hospitality. Always keep your eyes peeled because you never know what might swim by; otters, seals or maybe a humpback whale.



The best time to visit Canada is between May & October. Time your trip based on the wildlife you wish to see in this temperate climate.

2 Temple of Love

A UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the new seven wonders of the world, the Taj Mahal is the icon of India and a symbol of love known around the world. Beat the crowds and take in the view from across the Yamuna River at Agra Fort, just as Shah Jahan did during the last years of his life, after he was overthrown by his son and imprisoned there. Sunset provides amazing light in which to capture this monument.



3 Find Your Balance

People often think of India as a bustling and busy destinations but many places offer serene locations to unwind and disconnect from the outside world. India is home to one of the world's oldest holistic healing systems, developed more than 3,000 years ago, Ayurvedic medicine. Try a sunrise yoga class, followed by an Ayurvedic treatment, to end your holiday feeling rejuvenated.

If you prefer to explore a less-crowded Kenya, we recommend journeying to the dramatic landscape of the Great Rift Valley, a geological masterpiece that encompasses savannah plains and parched deserts with cool highlands and snow-capped mountains, as well as lush equatorial forests.

These endless opportunities for discovery, coupled with a fascinating history and colourful culture, make Kenya a wonderful choice for an unforgettable African adventure.

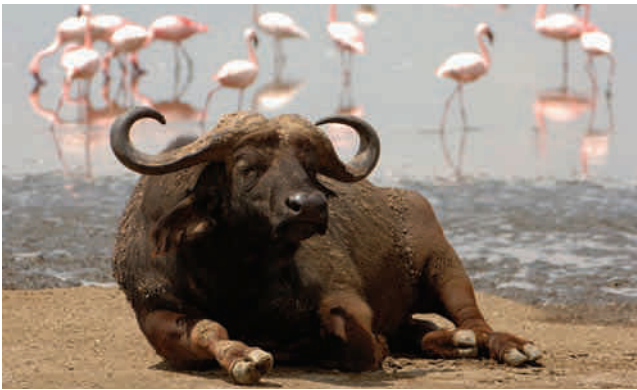
1 Nature's Greatest Show

The dramatics plays out on the stunning “stage” of the Maasai Mara, as the world’s largest migration reaches the banks of the river for the famous, and often raw, crossing of over 2 million animals. As one of the Seven Wonders of Africa, the migration draws many tourists each year to witness this spectacular event. However, if you prefer to go when it is a little less crowded, head there in October to experience both a pleasant climate and less visitors.



2 Flock Together

Another of Kenya’s national parks is famous for a different spectacle; huge flocks of pink flamingos gathering at the soda lake in Lake Nakuru National Park. The park is also home to both the black and the white rhino, the endangered Rothschild’s giraffe and several prides of lions, as well as being one of the best places in Kenya to spot a leopard.



3 Literary Inspiration

When in Nairobi, journey just 10km outside of town to visit the former African home of Danish author Karen Blixen, famous for her book, Out of Africa, which chronicles her life at the estate. Her book inspired a Hollywood movie by the same name that in turn inspired many to visit Kenya for themselves and discover the magic of this country.

DAY 1 - 3

From Nairobi, travel north to Elsa’s Kopje. This stunning location, is home to the Born Free story and offers an exclusive safari experience. With magnificent views of the plains, enjoy game drives away from the crowds. Large herds of elephants are a highlight in the most diverse wildlife park in East Africa.

DAY 4 - 6

Next, travel to the famous Lewa Wildlife Conservancy and stay at Kifaru House. The timeless tranquility of Africa will surround you, as you marvel at East Africa’s healthiest black and white rhino populations. With views of Mount Kenya from the conservancy, this five-room lodge is the perfect hideaway.

DAY 7 - 10

Or, follow the lion prides on the open plains of Busanga in Kafue National Park. Both Liuwa and Busanga offer a remote wilderness experience, where epic predator sightings await the adventurous traveller.



2 Land of the Leopard

South Luangwa National Park is famed for its leopards. With the park's forested habitat, these majestic cats thrive here. After your sundowner along the river and as the last of the sun's rays disappear, the Luangwa Valley becomes the perfect place to look for leopards starting their evening hunt. Early morning, you will often find a leopard returning to its tree for the day's rest, sometimes with its night's catch.



3 Behind the Scenes

Through our partnership with Game Rangers International and Lilayi Lodge, we can arrange for you a very special morning going behind the scenes of the Elephant Nursery. This amazing project rehabilitates and releases orphaned elephants back into the wild in Kafue National Park and gives our guests an inside look at what it takes to care for an orphaned elephant.

This seasonal location is a vast wetland and home to beautiful antelope, fish eagles and grand prides of lions. Base yourself at the beautiful Shumba Camp to experience true African wilderness.



See Victoria Falls at its mightiest in April through to May. Travel in August & September for outstanding game viewing in the dry season.

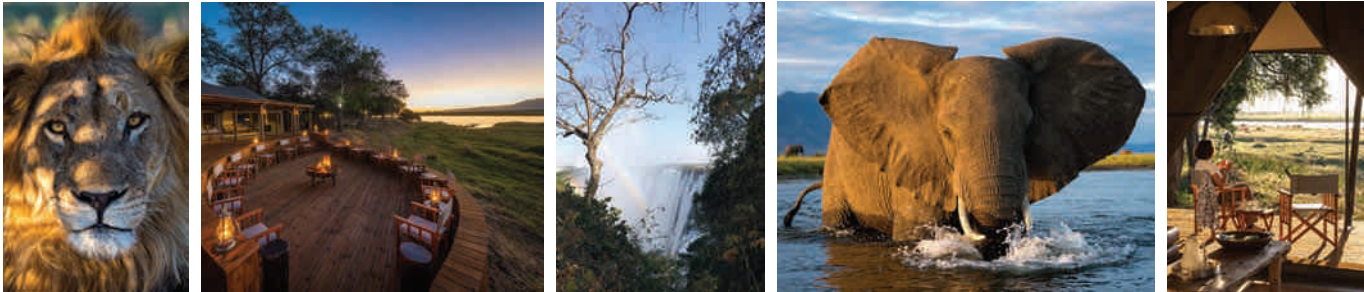
2 Tourism that Counts

3 The Smoke that Thunders
Victoria Falls, which straddles the border of Zimbabwe and Zambia, is classified as the world's largest sheet of falling water. One of the best ways to see the Falls is to take to the air. Whether by helicopter or micro-light flight, the views from above are breathtaking, as the Zambezi River plummets into the chasm below, resulting in a spray of water that can be seen for up to 30 miles away.
