Covington is truly a remarkable place. We have so much pride in serving our neighbors and caring for one another. As more individuals utilize the food bank services, we are seeing less donations come in by 26%. This is creating a deficit in available food for our vulnerable community members. Thankful is how we feel when we have a new family walk to our check-in/welcome station. We are excited they found us and that we can best assist them with nourishing food, hygiene items, diapers, and external resources through our collaborative partnerships. We continue to see amazing efforts shine bright through our weekend Backpack Buddies food program serving 1,000 bags a month for students at 9 KSD schools sites, our Hygiene Drive at the Dollar Tree supported by Boy Scouts of America Troop 407, a Spring Food Drive by The Patterson Team with Meridian and Mattson Middle Schools bringing in over 500 lbs, and our recent Mayor's Day of Concern bringing in 2,808 lbs of food in just a few hours! Because we have a community that cares about our friends, family, and neighbors we are making strides in bringing food security to the 98042.
