






FAIRMOUNT Winter/Spring 2024

Patti Susman

Director of Fairmount Youth Theatre

Patti is an honors graduate of Cleveland State University. She has a degree in Dramatic Arts. She has been with Fairmount since 1982, where she has directed over 80 productions. She has also taught dance, art and gymnastics.

Patti was the first Youth Theatre Director at the Solon Center for the Arts and was also an Assistant Director and instructor for the Heights Youth Theatre.

Patti trained as a dancer with Dave and Shirley Morganstern. She was a member of the Morgan Dancers. She and her sisters performed throughout the Cleveland area. She began her acting career at the old Musicarnival Theatre, located in Warrensville Hts. Ohio.

At age 13, she was selected as one of the youngest apprentices in the theatre's history. She spent 3 summers working, in various capacities, on Broadway touring company productions, concerts and children's theatre performances.

It was at Musicarnival that Patti was given the opportunity to teach and direct theatre classes to younger students and that is when she decided that arts education was her passion, and she has pursued that passion ever since.

What is the most satisfying part of your job?

I love to watch our students grow over time. One of the advantages of being at Fairmount Center for so long is that we get to watch the progression of our students. We see them gain confidence from one show to the next. We have had students receive college scholarships and even go all the way to Broadway, but it is that self esteem and confidence that our students take with them, wherever they go, that make us proud of what we do.

Did you imagine when you started at Fairmount in 1982 that you would still be teaching here in 2023?

Yes, I did imagine being at Fairmount for this long. I am one of the lucky people who does exactly what I have dreamed of doing. When I was young and performing professionally, I was given the opportunity to teach those younger than me. I realized then that I enjoyed sharing what I knew with others. When I started at Fairmount I was not married and had no kids. I taught everything including theatre, dance, art and gymnastics. I now have a husband, 2 sons and 4 grandkids. Fairmount has been through its ups and downs over the years, but its mission of sharing and teaching the arts has always been strong, and that is why I am still here.

If you were just starting your career as a performer today, what advice would you give your younger self? Big lesson in your career path?

I would tell my younger self to trust your self, trust your gut feelings and have confidence in your convictions. I would also say don't listen to the naysayers and the negative people. I always tell our students that they should not ever say, "I can't, say I can and I will." I wish that I had figured that out earlier, but it is my motto now.

Your favorite show-as a fan or as a director?

As a director my favorite show is always the one that I am working on. As a fan I like anything musical that tells a great story.



Amy Shea

Visual Arts Instructor Homeschool Instructor

Amy Shea received a B.A. from Cleveland State University in Visual Arts, licensed to teach grades K – 12. She taught in public schools for four years before having children. Amy continued to teach Art part time at Lakeland Community College in the Community Education Department and also Art History at Breckenridge Village.

Then, she taught at Grace Christian Academy for ten years as she homeschooled her two children. Currently, Amy teaches private and group lessons and is involved with the homeschool community in Lake and Geauga County.

Amy also enjoys teaching arts and crafts at a community horse camp during the summers. She loves to work with children in a creative manner and pursues her own artistic endeavors as well. Amy lives in Painesville with her husband and has two adult children.

Your favorite artist or art movement?

My favorite artist is Henry Ossawa Tanner.

With all that you're managing, do you have any time management secrets you would like to share?

My time management secret is to realize that I can take very small steps in order to accomplish something complicated.

What brings you the most joy as a teacher?

Watching children grow in confidence in creative, academic, social, and intrapersonal aspects is what I find most rewarding about teaching.

Describe a "perfect" day off, what would we be likely to find you doing?

On my 'perfect' day off you will find me drawing, spending time with my children, hiking in a forest, exploring, and reading.



Abigail Johnson

Music Director

Abigail is a multi-instrumentalist performer and composer who enjoys playing everything from folk to classical to electronic music.

She teaches violin, music theory, composition, and electronic music. Abigail was a student of CIM's preparatory school and suzuki program before earning her Bachelor of Music in Composition from Baldwin Wallace University.

She earned her MFA in Experimental Sound from California Institute of the Arts where she taught music theory and music history courses. Abigail has traveled all over the world for festivals and artist residencies including Alaska, New York City, and France.

Where did your love of music come from?

My love of music came from my family. Despite most of them never learning how to play an instrument, I was surrounded by a deep love of music from the beginning. Whether it was in the car with my grandpa, dancing in our living room with my cousins, or at the campground with my grandma, music was always at the center.

How have your global adventures influenced your teaching style?

Being able to experience concerts, artists' events, galleries, and classes in other countries has greatly influenced how open my teaching style is. I have learned that passion is the most important component to learning something new. Taking time to learn my students' passions and find a way to relate them to what we're learning is incredibly important.

Your favorite performer?

It's hard to pick one, but I would have to say Sarah Belle Reid. She is a trumpet player with a classical background who uses sensors and computer programs to create sounds to 'accompany' her while she plays her trumpet. She emphasizes experimentation and multi-disciplinary approaches and is one of my biggest influences.

Place or destination next on your "must visit" list?

It will most likely not be my next trip, but Java is high up on my list. I have played in a couple of Javanese Gamelan Ensembles and cherish those experiences. I would love to be able to experience a concert and maybe even play in Java one day.

DANCE



For more than 50 years, Fairmount Center for the Arts has brought high-quality dance instruction to Northeast Ohio. Classes are taught by professional dancers and dance instructors who bring a wealth of experience to our non-competitive, supportive environment. Since 2015, Fairmount has partnered with Ohio Contemporary Ballet (formerly Verb Ballet) to ensure the highest educational standards and ongoing professional development for dance faculty.

Whether you're a beginner or advanced student, Fairmount offers a dance class for you. All dancers are encouraged to participate in our spring dance performance on Saturday, May 11.

About Fairmount's Dance Offerings:

Ballet: Focuses on development of body alignment as it applies to ballet technique. Students will learn how to balance, turn, jump, and progress across the floor. Concepts such as musicality and performance quality are introduced in the Ballet curriculum. Kinderdance classes for ages 2-5 include both Ballet and Tap.

Hip Hop: Learn categories within Hip Hop such as poppin, body waves, locking, krumping, musicality, movement hitting, and more! This training will also help students connect more with music in a fun and structured way. Learn some of the most popular dance moves to popular music.

Contemporary Jazz: Develops strong technique, core strength, improvisational and choreographic skills as students gain a better understanding of body awareness, musicality, and character development to improve performance quality. Students focus on learning a variety of contemporary styles including jazz, lyrical, modern, and currentday, cutting-edge choreography.

Tap: Focuses on coordinating rhythmic movement with the feet and ankles. Students will develop speed and clarity in tap sounds while building on steps and rhythms. Kinderdance classes for ages 2-5 include both Ballet and Tap.

Pre-Pointe: A preparation class for ballet students interested in dancing en pointe. Students will work on strengthening the feet and ankles through conditioning exercises and barre work. Students must complete a Pre-Pointe test to ensure readiness for Pointe shoes.

Pointe: Designed for students with previous ballet training. Students will continue to build foot and ankle strength along with endurance for working in pointe shoes. By Faculty permission only.

Spanish Dance: Learn Flamenco, Regional, Classical, and Escuela Bolero styles. Emphasis on technique which includes compas, footwork, Palmas, upper body and arms, and castaneting.

Fairmount Dance Company and Fairmount Dance Company, Jr. (FDC & FDC Jr.)

Directed by Mason Alexander. Fairmount Dance Company is ballet-focused, with inclusion of conditioning, pilates, and yoga to complement the well-being of the dancer. FDC & FDC Jr. rehearse and perform additional works, both at Fairmount Center and throughout the community. FDC and FDC Jr. dancers must be concurrently enrolled at least at the Intermediate Ballet level to participate. Auditions will be held on Saturday, January 13 from 10:30AM-12:30PM.

Hip Hop Crew

Directed by Dance Director Andrea Belser McCormick. Hip Hop Crew learns additional dances to perform at community events and organizations throughout Northeast Ohio. Past performances include at Fairmount, Cleveland Cavaliers, Lake Erie Captains, and Akron Rubberducks, Dancers must be concurrently enrolled in an Intermediate or higher hip hop class and participate in weekly Hip Hop Crew rehearsals on Mondays. No audition required.

Spanish Dance Company

Directed by Sandi Bohl. Founded in 1972 by Libby Lubinger, the Fairmount Spanish Dance Company shares the tradition of this dance style through community performances, residencies, and demonstrations. 
