A LETTER FROM REV. LEANN HODGES



Dear Beloved in Christ.

Each year, as we enter this season of stewardship, we are invited to reflect on the ways our faith comes alive in daily living. Stewardship is not just about supporting a budget—it is about giving thanks to God for the abundance we have received, and trusting that, together, God will multiply our gifts to bless our community and world. Our theme this year, "Demonstrating Faith Through Generosity," reminds us that every act of giving is also an act of faith.

When we share what God has entrusted to us, we demonstrate that we trust God's promises. As you prayerfully consider your commitment this year, I encourage you to see your pledge as more than a financial transaction. It is a statement of faith, a response to God's grace, and a step into the future that God is calling us to build together. May your generosity be a testimony to the goodness of God at work among us.
