October Family Faith Challenge: The Rosary

Incorporate the Rosary into Family Prayer

The Rosary has been a beloved Catholic devotion for centuries. While legend tells us that the Blessed Virgin Mary gave the Rosary to St. Dominic, historical research shows that the habit of counting prayers with beads began long before his time as monks recited the 150 Psalms and



used simple beads to keep track. To learn more about the history of this powerful prayer, go to youtu.be/CIk2Gn9nvuQ for an informative video from Fr. Mike Schmitz.

While the Rosary involves a repetition of specific prayers, the goal is for us to meditate more deeply upon the mysteries of Christ's life as we pray. This month's challenge is to incorporate the Rosary into your family's prayer routine. This could involve saying the Rosary on a walk around the neighborhood after dinner a few nights of the week, praying a decade on the drive

to school in the morning, or whatever else fits into your family's schedule. Bishop Robert Baron has recorded scriptural meditations with the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious Mysteries, which can be viewed at wordonfire.org/rosary, in case it is helpful to simply follow along. October Virtue of the Month: Obedience

Obedience means assenting to rightful authority without hesitation or resistance. Assenting means to accept something, to say yes and act on it. Rightful authority means those who have been given the job of taking care of us. Without hesitation means that we should do what they ask promptly, right away, and without arguing. Jesus himself modeled the virtue of obedience for us, for, "though he was in the form of God, [he] did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men" (Phil 2:6-7).

Poem of the Month

On October 7, 1571, the Holy League (a collation of Catholic political powers along the Mediterranean) defeated the Ottoman Empire in the naval Battle of Lepanto. Having ordered the Christian faithful to fast and pray the Rosary prior to battle, Pope Pius V attributed the victory to Mary's intercession and instituted the feast of Our Lady on October 7 in gratitude for the victory. October has been the month of the Rosary ever since.

In 1911, the British writer and philosopher G.K. Chesterton created a literary depiction of this battle in his poem, "Lepanto", the first stanza of which we are including below. The full poem can be read at The Poetry Foundation website at poetryfoundation.org/poems/47917/lepanto.

Lepanto

by G.K. Chesterton

White founts falling in the courts of the sun, And the Soldan of Byzantium is smiling as they run; There is laughter like the fountains in that face of all men feared,

It stirs the forest darkness, the darkness of his beard.

It curls the blood-red crescent, the crescent of his lips,

For the inmost sea of all the earth is shaken with his ships.

They have dared the white republics up the capes of Italy,


They have dashed the Adriatic round the Lion of the Sea,

And the Pope has cast his arms abroad for agony and loss,

And called the kings of Christendom for swords about the Cross,

The cold queen of England is looking in the glass; The shadow of the Valois is yawning at the Mass; From evening isles fantastical rings faint the Spanish gun,

And the Lord upon the Golden Horn is laughing in the sun.



St. Teresa of Ávila (1515-1582) was a Spanish Carmelite nun who lived in the 16th century. She was a mystic and author of spiritual writings and poems. The originator of the Carmelite Reform, she founded numerous convents throughout Spain and restored a

contemplative life to the order. She became well known for the mystical experiences, many of which she described in her autobiography.

The first of only four women to be named a Doctor of the Church, St.

Teresa's ascetic doctrine and Carmelite reforms shaped Roman Catholic contemplative life, and her writings on the Christian soul's journey to God are considered works of art. Her writings, especially the "Way of Perfection" and "The Interior Castle," have helped generations of believers.

St. Teresa of Avila died on Oct. 15, 1582. She was canonized on March 22, 1622, along with three of her greatest contemporaries: St. Ignatius Loyola, St. Francis Xavier, and St. Philip Neri.
