Discussion

- 13. Consider this situation: You have been studying God's Word for a while, and you are progressing. You are starting to put a group together. You are told of an unexpected death and are asked to provide a message of comfort and prayer for the family. Should you speak, and if so, what should you say?
- 14. What questions have you learned to ask to analyze a text for use in devotions?

- 15. Once you have explored these questions and you have prayed for God's guidance and blessing, how can the devotion be organized and presented?
- 16. With your teacher, practice using this method to create a devotion using Psalm 103.
- 17. Now that you have learned how to organize a devotion, you will work during the rest of the course to create a kind of directory of situations in which you would like to share the Word. What ideas do you have?
- 18. Part of the final project of this course is to use the list you have just created and fill this directory with a Psalm suitable for each occasion. How can this be accomplished?
