

I love the old grainy photo below of my dad and his six kids (I'm the youngest, the whiny looking one in the stylish sweater vest). What I love is his hands on our shoulders. That's the way he parented - definitely a hands-on father.



Sometimes those hands pointed to a pile of work I still hadn't done, sometimes they patted me on the back when I did something right, other times they stung my bottom when I stepped out of line. But more often, they reached under me to pick me up after a fall, or rested gently on my shoulder, guiding me in the direction I needed to go next. I trusted those hands throughout my childhood and they never steered me wrong.

Someone once said: My father didn't tell me how to live; he lived, and let me watch him do it. My father was definitely that kind of role model, but he also took the time to explain why he did what he did.

He would teach me about life whenever we worked together. Pulling weeds taught me about uprooting bad habits, directing ants with my shovel blade illustrated how God leads me, building a house was all about the stages of life, and appreciating the beauty of daffodils in the spring and sumacs in the fall is recognizing the handiwork of a loving Creator. Some of the lessons were his way of dealing with specific things I was going through. How caulking the sundeck became a metaphor in my one and only sex talk with Dad will remain our little secret.

My dad believed the Bible was God's Instruction Manual for Life, and he was right! His words and his actions confirmed it. He often claimed the promise recorded in Proverbs 22:6: Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it.


