ORDER GRANTING LEAVE TO PROCEED UNDER 28 U.S.C. § 1915

Plaintiff Olivia Ballage resides in Colorado Springs, Colorado. On May 13, 2021, Plaintiff filed *pro se* an *Employment Discrimination Complaint* and part of an *Application to Proceed in District Court Without Prepaying Fees or Costs (Long Form)* (ECF Nos. 1, 3). In apparent response to the Court's order to cure,¹ Plaintiff has filed a fully completed *Application to Proceed in District Court Without Prepaying Fees or Costs (Long Form)* (ECF No. 8). Plaintiff will be granted leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* under 28 U.S.C. § 1915 solely based on inability to prepay fees or give security therefor.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that the *Application to Proceed in District Court Without Prepaying Fees or Costs (Long Form)* (ECF No. 8) is **granted**. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that the *Application to Proceed in District Court Without Prepaying Fees or Costs (Long Form)* (ECF No. 3) is **denied as moot**. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that the court review Plaintiff's pleading pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B). It is

FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of Court shall not issue process at this time. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that the United States Marshals Service shall serve process on any remaining defendant(s) for whom personal service is required if the case is later drawn to a district judge or a magistrate judge under D.C.COLO.LCivR 8.1(c).
