Key Strategy

Demonstrate the Need

Adequately show how MIH will impact their issue.

- Access to care
- Serve an underserved population
- Reduce total medical expenses (TME)



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EXPECT A LACK OF UNDERSTANDING

Key Strategy

Explain The Program

Be able to explain MIH/CP in 3 minutes AND be able to explain in detail

Know how programs can be operationalized to serve a community to solve a targeted need



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ASKING THEM TO "FIGURE OUT FUNDING" IS NOT A STRATEGY

Define How the Program will Achieve Sustainable Funding

Sustainable funding may be a stretch goal...

Have a path to funding, ROI or an "ask"
