

In line with the "ISO-20121" guidelines we have introduced a series of practices and commitments to ensure we work to create a more sustainable future focusing on reducing our carbon footprint and waste: -

REDUCE WASTE

- Add value. Any gift, or personalisation must be desirable as a keepsake, or multi-functional and not a fleeting item of novelty.
- Be accurate. Minimise contingency supply of food and supplies working on final guest numbers.
- Blanket ban. The use of any single-use plastic items, notably water bottles.
- **Boost technology**. Offer improved creativity within digital and hybrid events to maintain their appeal post pandemic.
- Reserve power. Ensure generators are the correct size only.
- Be mindful. Sustainable suppliers of not just food but all event set & design. Use local suppliers, particularly for heavy items.

RECYCLE

- **Follow through**. Ensuring not just the purchase of recyclable materials where possible, but the correct sorting and disposal of them.
- Re-purpose. Shredded office paper used for packaging at events.

RE-USE

- Store. Store set items for multiple use or give to a fellow supplier to re-use.
- Avoid disposals. Re-use packaging, and crew's onsite water bottles and coffee cups.
- **Donate**. Agree excess food and post event florals will be managed, and/or donated to charity or local care homes.

WORK TOGETHER

- Integrate sustainability. Flag options to the client for their consideration, from the start of the planning process.
- Collaborate. Work with suppliers and experts who share our values and look further than simply greenwashing.
- Train. All staff & event crew made aware of required protocols at each event.
- Adapt. Address each event individually. E.g., Offsetting carbon emissions for an event where a lot of travel may be concerned. Whilst a two-day event may need to consider more localised environmental impact.
- Learn. Share and be open to creative ideas. A bar company showed us how they flatpack all empty boxes to repurpose as floor levellers and protection under and behind bars at events.
- Assess. We will review our approach annually and implement new measures and ideas as they arise.
