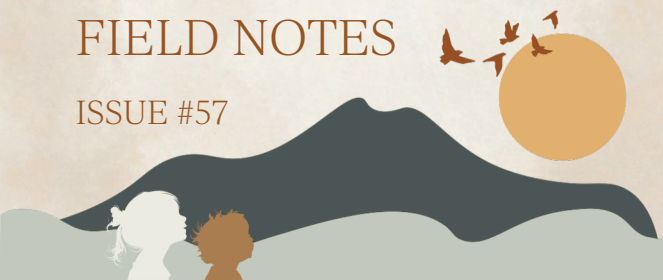

While working for the Warner Park Nature Center, my team found a bee swarm in a tree a few feet off the ground. Many people fear bee swarms because they think they will harm people. As you learn about these swarms, you will understand that the bees are not normally aggressive during this time.

Bees will swarm if their hive is full and crowded. The queen bee will lead a group of bees to a nearby tree to wait while scout bees go on a search for a new home. Before leaving the hive, the bees fill their bellies with honey for their journey. With bellies full, they are less apt to sting. They will hunt for food near their new home when it is time.

While watching the bee swarm in the park, the team of naturalists decided to gently touch the swarm. I didn't want to miss this opportunity even though I was very nervous. I slipped my hand into the mass of bees. It was amazing. I could feel their little wings fluttering against my skin. Because I moved slowly and very gently, they didn't feel threatened or sting me.
