Auditors from FHA were on site and met individually with each staff person working day shifts and evening shifts on May 14 & 15. Their purpose was to assess compliance with Covid screening, level of staff Covid awareness, staff knowledge of safety precautions, as well as the overall mood and atmosphere of the building. Both auditors reported that Buchanan met or exceeded expectations. They noted staff knowledge was "very good" and staff were: "...generally happy to come to work"; "...feel well-equipped"; "...feel supported by management"; "...aware of precautions"; and "...

FHA Licensing also conducted an inspection. Recommendations were to install more wall mounted hand sanitizers and create greater separations of residents at mealtime. Sanitizers have been on backorder and we have been exploring options to create greater separation. We want to balance the need to separate with the benefits of socialization. Overall, a very positive report.

Worksafe BC's audit was more from the perspective of keeping staff safe from Covid. The audit involved review of staff education and other required measures. The report was also reassuring with
