Providence Heights is a place where the past does not define the future, creativity is unlocked, and purpose is discovered and defined.

Preventative care is ingrained in every major system, such as health care. We believe it is also a key to caring for our society, and that is the heart of PH: prevention and transformation.

Some 30 years ago, a young, single, 19-year-old mom of three found herself alone with no resources at her disposal. She did not have anyone to help her, and she did not qualify for government support. She was trapped with nowhere to go, bearing unimaginable struggles, while trying to plan for not only her future, but the future of her three children.

This is the story of our Founder & CEO. Over the years, she can't help but think about how things



might have been different for her if there had been an opportunity to change the trajectory of her life, **discover her true purpose**, and access to resources needed to accelerate her career. She wonders, what if, on top of all of that, she was able to protect and provide for her family within a collaborative community?

The passion to prevent and to provide options is what fueled the vision to found Providence Heights. While our Founder's story is textured with tragedy, the more devastating truth lies in the fact that while this cycle happens all too frequently, it is also, all too **preventable.**♦ "I KNOW WHAT I AM DOING. When we opened our doors in March 2021, Providence Heights began with six women and four children. Some women came to us feeling stuck, without a high school diploma, with low self-esteem, and needing an opportunity to receive coaching and training to move towards their calling.

Now, after 18 months of helping women discover their purpose, we are humbled to share a few highlights of the brave, strong, faith-filled women who have moved on or will be moving on from PH.

One woman who came to PH with no GED and no job is leaving with a supervisory role at a new company and is expected to receive her GED by January 2023.

One woman moved into PH with her son, coming from an extremely unhealthy living environment and both struggling with autism. When the son arrived at PH, he would not speak and avoided interacting with people. With help from the PH team, she was able to get her son the proper help he needed to succeed. He now fully engages with the other children and community members at PH, and at school. She was also accepted to Northwest University to complete her bachelor's degree in music.

One woman entered PH without a job, high school diploma, or family support. She has now completed two of the three tests to receive her GED and is expected to finish the last course by the end of 2022. Her passion is the fashion industry, and through her business mentor, she was able to enter a Disney costume creation contest and was a finalist in the competition. All of this has boosted her confidence and credentials for her resume.

One woman entered PH from Seattle's Union Gospel Mission with her then-two-year-old daughter. She had endured a lifetime of abuse and trauma. Her passion quickly was discovered, in helping women and to work at PH, and through her time here she was able to build on her business skills and begin her own business. This business now makes a profit, and she employs women enrolled at PH to help make her products.

Another woman felt stuck in where she was in her career and with her small business. She knew that she needed a catalyst to help move her in the right direction. Since enrolling at PH, she has received coaching and training to propel her forward to prepare to launch into her career path.

This is just a brief glance at some of the highlights spanning from March 2021 - Fall 2022. What an honor it is to be used by God to help women discover their purpose and launch into the future God has designed for each of them.◆

Oh How He Loves Me

Charity Joy's story is a love story. "I never knew what true love was... or even really meant. I only knew love as tough love."

Growing up, Charity Joy's family had no foundation of healthy love. She watched as her family broke apart, and her definition of true, healthy, agape love was distorted.

In July 2021, she and her son, Elijah, came to visit Seattle from San Diego. She had begun a life in San Diego with her son and she had met Jesus in a real way there. Her former pastors, who were a major part of her life, had moved to the Seattle area to plant a church, and they had invited her to come spend a week with them. It was during this time that Charity Joy was introduced to Providence Heights. All signs pointed her to Providence Heights, and, in faith, Charity made the decision to go. With that act of faith, everything fell into place.

"This is where God wanted me to be...In my vision board in 2020, I had a vision of girls in a community that were going to flourish. I was a part of that family."

Charity had lived a life of independence to avoid relying on anyone else. Stepping into life in community was a major transition for her, but she quickly realized that God had clearly ordained her steps. He had given her a community of women that could walk with her and grow with her.

Since moving to Seattle and becoming a part of the PH family, Charity has continued to learn about the overwhelming love and provision of God. As she prepares to graduate from Providence Heights in December 2022 and launch out, she is seeing the fruit of all her hard work, prayers, and time at PH.

Earlier this fall, Charity began a job at a faith-based nonprofit that works to break the generational cycle of homelessness by working with single parents and their children. She is a Child and Youth Program Specialist and her dream of working with young people who are suffering from deep trauma has come to life.

Even through her job, Charity has come full circle in her walk with God.

"In the beginning, I was asking myself, am I worthy of all of this? I have always had to work for things and am not accustomed to receiving things. I know now that God wants to bless me and provide for me. And I know how much he loves me and wants to give me things. I am worthy of receiving things.

I can say that God is the love of my life, and I truly know what that means. I love seeing what PH has done in me and the other ladies. PH has helped me in so many ways, and I have changed so much, especially in how I approach things." In 2021, Jannice was scrolling through Facebook and saw a post from an old friend. This friend was Christine Soule, CEO and Founder of Providence Heights.

Christine's post described Providence Heights, and Jannice engaged in a conversation with her, commenting on the post.

Fast-forward several months to August 2021, when Jannice moved in and joined the Providence Heights family. "I felt like I already belonged when I moved in. I found a place where I can be vulnerable and share without feeling rejected or judged."

Entrepreneurship had always been Jannice's dream. When she joined Providence Heights, she already had several businesses up and running, but she knew that there was more for her than what she was doing.

Providence Heights provided her with a safe place to build confidence and sharpen her leadership abilities, all while learning the valuable lesson of creating space for the Lord to move. For someone who had always been selfsufficient, her heart was open and eager for what God has for her in the future, namely healthy, strong relationships. She had always struggled with rejection and feeling out of place.

Jannice will be graduating from Providence Heights in December, and she is excited about what the future holds, but it is bittersweet as she has built incredible friendships and found strong community.

She is leading marketplace ministry groups at her church and Jannice looks forward to sharing everything she has downloaded in the last year to others. She has also begun cultivating an exciting idea that marries the lunch hour with creativity: "Lunch Hour Creative Power" and has begun hosting pop ups around the Seattle-area, providing customers with the opportunity to exercise their creativity during their lunch hour.

Creativity Unlocking

When asked about what Providence Heights is to Jannice, she says, "This is a place for healing, for transformation, to get unstuck, to learn a lot, and to discover your true purpose."



From Religion to Redemption

After losing her job in the healthcare industry during the pandemic in March 2020, she decided to pursue her love of children by applying for a position as a preschool teacher.

Although she loved her job, she endured a significant pay cut which resulted in a variety of complications.

Little did she know what God had in store for her. Fast-forward to December 31, 2021, when Natalie enrolled at PH. This was the date that marked the start of a new chapter in her life.

During her first months at PH, Natalie was laser-focused on working hard to earn and maintain her salvation. So much was changing for her, both internally and externally, she kept with what she knew – working hard because nothing was for free. "The Lord saw my heart... and his love is wild. He didn't leave me like that. Trying to prove my salvation. Instead, He gave me this revelation of my salvation — that it is a gift, and you do not earn gifts. They are freely given."

This changed a lot for Natalie. Admittedly, she had never really had true friends. In her words "I didn't know anything about how to do that." However, she intentionally took a season of rest over the summer of 2022 and focused on building community and friendships.

"I used the things I learned in my communications class at PH to actually build relationships with people. It allowed me to experience God's love in a way that I had not before. I had always been really isolated before."

All of this led to a major turning point for Natalie.

Seven years ago, she started her college journey at WSU. She had always been smart and able to skate through school without doing a lot of work. College life was different, and in the last semester of her senior year, she flunked out. She was left with tens of thousands of dollars of school debt, maxed-out credit cards, and an open balance to the school.

Today, Natalie is working at a childcare facility and plans to finish that last semester so she can receive her bachelor's degree in medical science. During the ten months she has been at PH, she has discovered exactly what she wants to do: take her passion for childcare and combine it with science and data to do childcare differently.

She has created a plan to get out of debt and to save for her last semester's tuition. Natalie has taken everything she has learned and applied it to her life to create her launching pad.

"I'm really expectant and excited for my future. God is bringing redemption to every part of my story. Where I was carrying shame and thinking things were not possible, the Lord is saying not only do you get Me, but you get to redeem every part of your life."◆ As a child, Eva Burke struggled with depression, belonging and confidence. She closed herself off emotionally and being homeschooled only made it harder to make friends or have any sort of social life.

"I was homeschooled my whole life and very shy. I had no friends. I was depressed. I never felt like I belonged. I was so desperate and hungry for a change."

When her mother approached her in January 2021 to join her in applying to Providence Heights, Eva felt peace for the first time about her future. "When I thought about staying home with my dad, I did not feel peace, but when I thought about applying to Providence Heights, I felt peace."

Eva began the program on the first day Providence Heights opened its doors in March 2021. She recalls observing the other women in her class and thinking to herself which ones she could see herself getting along with, and those who she couldn't.

"God has a sense of humor," she says as she speaks of how almost immediately the women in the program became her family... with those she did not see herself getting along with now becoming her closest friends.

Her struggle with identity and confidence were major obstacles for her, "I didn't really like myself before. I hadn't thought of myself as being good at anything." Exciled and Ready

However, during the first weeks at Providence Heights, all the ladies took a skills assessment and Eva realized for the first time, seeing on paper, that she had lots of potential. It was a defining moment for her.

During her time at Providence Heights, Eva started her own car detailing business, managed the Providence Collective website that features all the products offered, and taught other women the skills she learned along the way. In her own words in January 2022, "I'm just excited to go out into the world and show the world who I am."

Fast-forward now eight months and Eva has certainly accomplished that. In the spring of 2022, she was approached by an entrepreneurial company that was opening a new short-term rental management company in the Seattle area. They had heard about her work ethic and attention to detail in her car detailing business and were interested in bringing her on to help manage some of their properties.

Since then, her hard work has continued to pay off. In early fall of 2022, Eva was offered a management position and is going to be managing a team of people.

"It feels really good. I never thought I would have a job like this, an office job, ever. I did not realize how much of my time at PH—in classes and teaching classes would help me adjust to this position. Sitting in an office feels normal. Everything we did at PH helped me switch my mindset."◆



In 2019, a vision for a future property was given to our CEO. It was a community that included a residential tower, an office tower, and retail space to allow for a restaurant, spa, daycare, church, cafe, and boutique. A rendering was created to visualize the concept that same year.

In October of 2021, Providence Heights was given the opportunity to view a hotel property that was off-market.

The hotel property meets every detail sketched in the rendering. Providence Heights is currently under contract to purchase the 120,000 sq foot property, with a closing date of early 2023.

We have the opportunity to own a building with a monthly mortgage payment that is lower than our current lease. We will be able to direct our funds toward a home, rather than a temporary lease. Once we secure ownership of the property, we plan to expand our program and sustainable income immediately. The property will give us 88 rooms and additional space to grow Providence Collective. We will be able to expand our reach to transform more lives, grow our sustainable income, create jobs, and launch new businesses. The revenue potential is enormous, with the tangible opportunity to create all the things that our CEO envisioned: a restaurant, spa, daycare, church, cafe, boutique and more.

This is an exciting time for Providence Heights, and we deeply believe that it is our mandate to join hands with the Church and other organizations to model the Acts 2 church by caring for every person and creating a launchpad and stable support system within a Christ-centered community.

As we move forward, it's always important to look back to the past. Let's pause to remember and draw inspiration from our namesake, Providence Heights. As we think about opening a daycare and school in our new building, we remember that the Sisters of Providence opened the first permanent school in the Pacific Northwest in 1857, and it was called Providence Academy.


