
- 1. Roll the die and move the number of spaces indicated on the die.
- 2. If you land on a mountain, river or tree space, grab a card with the same image and have a player read you the question from that pile. If you answer correctly, you collect a wisdom stone. Answer incorrectly, you stay where you are and do not collect a stone.
- 3. Along the way there are rewards and challenges where you can either be rewarded a wisdom stone or lose a turn.
- 4. The first player to collect the most wisdom stones by the end of the game, wins.

Answer: They store snow and ice, which melts into rivers and streams.

Answer: Pine trees, wildflowers, moss.

Answer: The air is thinner, meaning there is less oxygen.

Question: Why is clean water important for all living things?

Question: What is one way to keep rivers clean?

Answer: Avoid dumping waste, reduce pollution, clean up litter.

Question: Why do rivers flow?

Answer: Gravity pulls water from higher elevations to lower ones.

Question: What is a watershed?

Answer: An area of land where all the water drains into the same river or stream.

Question: How do Indigenous peoples use rivers?

Answer: For fishing, transportation, ceremonies, and as a water source.

Question: Why do fish migrate in rivers?

Answer: To find food, mate, or lay eggs.



Question: How do rivers shape the land over time?

Answer: They create valleys and canyons by eroding soil and rock.

Question: What do trees give us to breathe?

Answer: Oxygen.

Question: Name one type of tree found in a forest.

Answer: Oak, pine, maple, birch.

Question: Why are trees important for the soil?

Answer: Their roots hold the soil in place and prevent erosion.

Question: What is a tree's role in the water cycle?

Answer: Trees absorb water through their roots and release it into the air as water vapor (transpiration).

Question: Name one animal that lives in or depends on trees.

Answer: Squirrels, birds.

Question: Why do trees lose their leaves in the fall?

Answer: To conserve energy and water during the colder months.

Question: What is the name of the process where trees make their own food?

Answer: Photosynthesis.
