Running your own business means juggling a lot — don't let missed deductions be one of them! This checklist will help you track potential write-offs so you can keep more of what you earn and make tax season a little less stressful.

<b>■</b> General Business Expenses
Everyday costs of running your business — from office supplies and software to professional fees,

Business insurance premiums Business licenses and permits Legal and professional fees (tax prep, bookkeeping, consulting) Bank or credit card fees for business accounts Merchant or payment processing fees (Square, PayPal, etc.) Office supplies (paper, pens, postage, etc.) Software subscriptions and online tools (QuickBooks, Canva, Zoom, etc.) Continuing education or certifications Dues or memberships for professional organizations Business-related books, courses, or reference materials
Home Office (if applicable)
xpenses related to the portion of your home used regularly and exclusively for business. This includes

□ Portion of rent or mortgage interest
□ Utilities (electric, internet, water, trash)
□ Repairs or maintenance for your office space
□ Office furniture and equipment
□ Homeowners or renters' insurance (business portion)

part of your rent or mortgage, utilities, and office furnishings.



#### **REMEMBER:**

Your home office must be used regularly and exclusively for business to qualify for this deduction!

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## ⇒Vehicle & Travel

Business-related transportation and travel expenses such as mileage, parking, tolls, airfare, hotels, and other costs when traveling for work purposes.
<ul> <li>□ Business mileage (keep a log or use an app)</li> <li>□ Parking fees and tolls</li> <li>□ Auto insurance (business portion)</li> <li>□ Maintenance and repairs related to business use</li> <li>□ Airfare, hotels, and rental cars for business trips</li> <li>□ Ride shares or taxis for business appointments</li> </ul>
Marketing & Advertising
Everything you spend to promote your business — websites, ads, email platforms, printed materials, sponsorships, and client gifts.
<ul> <li>Website hosting and domain fees</li> <li>Business cards, flyers, or brochures</li> <li>Paid ads (Google, Facebook, etc.)</li> <li>Email marketing tools (Mailchimp, ConvertKit, etc.)</li> <li>Sponsorships, local ads, or promotional materials</li> <li>Client gifts (limit \$25 per recipient per year)</li> </ul>
Employee & Contractor Costs
Payments to others who help you run your business — employee wages, contract labor (like freelancers or 1099s), payroll fees, and benefits.
<ul> <li>Wages, salaries, or bonuses</li> <li>Contract labor (1099-NEC payments)</li> <li>Payroll taxes and processing fees</li> <li>Employee benefits (health insurance, retirement contributions)</li> <li>Uniforms or branded workwear</li> </ul>
mRent & Utilities
Costs for your office, storefront, or workspace — rent, electricity, internet, cleaning services, and other facility-related expenses.
<ul> <li>□ Rent for office, storefront, or storage</li> <li>□ Utilities (electric, internet, phone, water)</li> <li>□ Janitorial or cleaning services</li> <li>□ Security or alarm monitoring fees</li> </ul>

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### Equipment & Assets

Purchases that last longer than a year, such as computers, tools, and machinery, along with repairs of lepreciation of those assets.	or
<ul> <li>Computers, tablets, or phones used for business</li> <li>Printers, cameras, or specialized tools</li> <li>Equipment repairs and maintenance</li> <li>Depreciation (for large purchases used over time)</li> </ul>	
Other Common Deductions	
Additional items like meals, insurance premiums, retirement contributions, taxes, interest, or bad deb hat may also be deductible.	ots
<ul><li>☐ Business meals (50% deductible if directly business-related)</li><li>☐ Health insurance premiums (self-employed)</li></ul>

- Keep receipts or digital copies of all expenses
- ✓ Use a separate business bank account
- ✓ Track mileage and home office details all year
- ✓ When in doubt, ask your tax professional
