


ANNOUCING NEW COACHING CHAIR

His brother, Braven, narrowly missed the bantam division title but remains focused on Olympic qualification in Santo Domingo. Skylar Park, already headed to the Paris Olympics, cheered on her siblings. Meanwhile, Hannah Driedger withdrew due to injury, Austin Wiebe placed fifth in men's poomsae, and Kelly McKenna was recognized as Best Female Pomsae Referee. Over 50 volunteers ensured the event's success, with the youth, cadet, and junior nationals on the horizon for July.

Did you know? Sport Manitoba Coaching is committed to facilitating the growth and development of coaches and officials at the community level, aiming to lessen the hurdles for their training and evaluation. Reach out to coaching@sportmanitoba.ca.

Eligible Professional Development:

- National Coach Certification Program (NCCP) sport-specific courses and coach evaluations (if the coach covers full costs).
- Officials training & evaluations approved by the Provincial Sport Organization (PSO).
- Professional development sponsored or approved by Sport Manitoba Coaching, PSO, or National Sport Organization (NSO).
- First Aid Training.

Eligible Expenses Include:

• Mileage (\$0.45/km for travel over 40km), accommodations (if necessary), meals within the province, and course/evaluation fees (specific conditions apply).

Eligibility Requirements: All Manitoba coaches must have active Respect in Sport certification and be a PSO member to receive a coach assistance grant. Visit <u>http://www.sportmanitoba.ca/coaching/respect-sport</u> to complete Respect in Sport or locate your certification number.

Assistance Available:

• A 50/50 cost share up to \$1,000 per year per sport for individual coaches/officials.

<u>Application Process</u>: Submit your application at least 2 weeks before your event or course through the provided Google form, including a proposed budget. A post-event report is required for funding release, with payments taking up to 6 weeks.
