What if the *best moments* of your wedding day happen when the *sun begins to slow down*?

Golden Hour is that short window before sunset when the light turns soft, warm, and incredibly flattering. It's when skin tones glow, emotions feel deeper, and everything looks effortlessly romantic.

WHY GOLDEN HOUR MATTERS

Even if your ceremony takes place at noon, when the sun is bright and shadows are strong, you can still have stunning portraits afterward. By planning a little extra time before sunset, we can capture relaxed, natural photos during Golden Hour — those glowing, soft moments that truly highlight your connection and the details of your day.

Simply put, better light means better photos and films.



PLANNING YOUR CEREMONY TIME

Planning your ceremony a few hours before sunset gives us the perfect opportunity to capture glowing Golden Hour portraits after your vows.

AIM TO START YOUR CEREMONY:

- About 2 hours before sunset if you're doing a First Look
- About 3 hours before sunset if you're seeing each other for the first time at the aisle

This timeline gives us the perfect opportunity to step aside after the ceremony and take portraits during Golden Hour. If these timing windows don't fit your day, simply plan a short window to step away for sunset portraits later on. Golden Hour gives us soft, flattering light that highlights your connection and captures those once-in-a-lifetime reactions without rushing your day. Your ceremony doesn't have to chase the sun — it just needs a moment with it.

THAT “JUST MARRIED” GLOW

Golden Hour isn't just for portraits — it's for moments.

Around sunset, we'll set aside a few quiet minutes for you to step away together. No crowd, no pressure. Just the two of you, soaking it all in as newlyweds while the light is at its softest and most romantic.

For indoor ceremonies, especially in churches where flash is often not allowed, thoughtful timeline planning is still key. While the ceremony happens indoors, Golden Hour becomes the perfect opportunity for portraits afterward, giving us beautiful, natural light to balance the story of your day and capture those soft, romantic moments before the reception begins.
