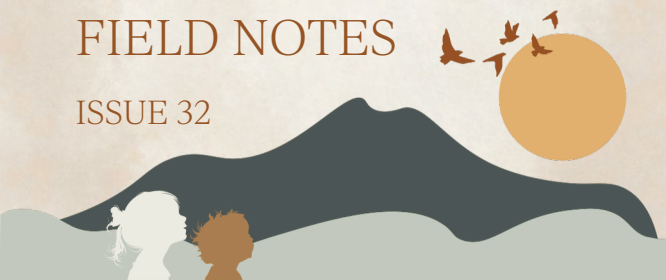

Elk

CERVIDAE (DEER FAMILY)

HABITAT & DIET


Elk live in many different habitats across the United States and Canada. They like the mountainous west, forests, and meadows. At one time, they roamed across North America. Their habitat is now smaller. They are herbivores, eating only plants, and prefer areas with lots of vegetation to eat and water.

FUN FACTS

“Wapiti” is the Native American word for elk, meaning “white rump,” after an elk’s light-colored fur on their rump. Male elk shed and regrow antlers every year.
