General Regulations

Concessions

- All concessionaires on the grounds must comply with the sanitary regulations as required by the State Food and Drug Division, and the Champaign County Health Department.
- The Board of Directors reserves the right to cancel any contract, if in its judgment the business or exhibition carried on by the concessionaire is objectionable. The property of the concessionaire would be removed from the grounds. All payment previously made under the contract shall then be forfeited.
- No space shall be sublet to anyone, unless permission is granted by the Fisher Community Fair Board.
- Any individual or organization operating a food concession on the fairgrounds will be obligated to the Fisher Fair Association in the amount of \$150 per day for operation of the food stand.
- Amount paid will include all utilities used during the fair.
- Payment must be made during the week of the fair.
- All food concession stands are required to have their own insurance coverage and must produce a certificate of insurance to the fair office before the beginning of the fair.

Special Rules and Regulations

- Premium money will be paid to exhibitors as soon as the department is judged and books balanced.
- All premium checks must be cashed within 60 days following the fair.
- Any checks outstanding after September 30, 2025, will not be honored.
- Checks will be ready for Exhibit Building Thursday, July 10, 2025, after 6:00 p.m. Please pick up on Thursday after 6pm or Friday.
- Premiums will not be paid for any event not held.
- All bleacher and grandstand seating is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Unattended reservation of seats is not allowed.
- The Fisher Community Fair and Horse Show intends to award all prizes and premiums listed within this Schedule of Events and Premiums booklet. Payment of these premiums is based upon continued support from the Illinois Department of Agriculture's Premium Prize Fund. The Fisher Community Fair and Horse Show reserves the right to amend premiums and prizes based upon support from this fund.

Disclaimer

In no case shall the Fisher Community Fair Association or any of its officers be held responsible for any loss, damage, injury, or disability by disease or from theft or from any other cause to such property, or to any person coming upon said Fisher Community fairgrounds, while said person or property are on the Fisher Community fair- grounds.

General Regulations

- The Fisher Community Fair hereby refuses to assume any responsibility for the safety as bailee or otherwise of any property brought upon said fairgrounds — said property being brought upon and kept upon said grounds at the owner's risk.
- The Fisher Community Fair refuses to assume responsibility for injuries to the person of any exhibitor or their officers and employees or to any patrons or other persons coming upon the grounds of the Fisher Community Fair. No claim for injury to any person or property shall be asserted or suit instituted or maintained against the Fisher Community Fair, its officers, agents, representatives or employees from said cause by any person having license or privilege to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupying any space thereon, and it is part of the consideration for such license or privilege that such claims for damages are specifically waived.
- Each concessionaire is expected to deal honestly and fairly with the public, and any attempt at fraud or misrepresentation will be considered sufficient cause for revoking the privilege.
- Concessionaires and exhibitors will be required to keep their places neat and clean and must remove all litter and filth from within and surrounding their allotted space. They must be operated to comply with Illinois laws on gambling and pure food laws.
- *It is illegal to carry a firearm, deadly weapon, or dangerous ordinance anywhere on these premises.

Additional Fisher Fair Information

- **Exhibitors' Passes**—All exhibitors must pay to enter the fairgrounds. All livestock exhibitors must have a livestock exhibitors' season ticket which may be purchased (\$15 each, limit 2) at the time livestock is entered.
- **Camper Fees** – \$40 all week camping on the grounds. Pay in fair office. Campers must be self-sufficient. Limited hookups available. Space is limited, please contact Todd Cotter 217-493-8680.
- **Senior Citizens** — All senior citizens, 60 years or older, will be admitted free on Senior Citizens' Day, Saturday, July 12, 2025, between opening and 4:00 p.m. No refunds on season tickets on Senior Citizens' Day.
- If your attendance at the Fisher Community Fair and Horse Show requires special needs, call the fair office at 217.897.1437 to request accommodations.
- **Handicap Accessible parking spaces** are available on the fairgrounds. Entrance must be made at the north gate only and park behind the grandstands.
- Enter at the north gate only for all motor sports
- **NO WEAPONS ON THE FAIRGROUNDS**
- **NO GLASS BOTTLES ON THE FAIRGROUNDS**
- **NO DOGS ON THE FAIRGROUNDS**, except for the Mutt Show on Saturday, July 12!
- Concert tickets will be for sale at the office window during fair week on the north side of Glades Hall.

2025 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements

County Fairs

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits.

All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

2. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. If an official electronic CVI is utilized, the exhibitor should be able to log on and show Bureau of Animal Health Personnel the completed CVI.

CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.

3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.

Animal identification number (AIN): A numbering system for the official identification of individual animals in the United States that provides a nationally unique identification number for each animal. The AIN consists of 15 digits, with the first 3 being the country code (840 for the United States or a unique country code for any U.S. territory that has such a code and elects to use it in place of the 840 code).

4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
5. CVIs for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
6. CVIs for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise.

Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

In the event of the suspicion of or diagnosis of a foreign animal disease, emerging animal disease, or other actionable disease, animals may be subject to quarantine on the fairgrounds until such time that it is determined that the disease is no longer a threat.

8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. Examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.

9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited.

Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.

10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

Brucellosis

1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following: Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)
 - Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within **30 days prior to exhibition**.
 - Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

All Dairy Cattle (In-State and Out-of-State)

A rRT-PCR test for Influenza A virus (IAV) on milk from lactating dairy cattle exhibiting at the county fair shall be conducted prior to livestock arriving on the fairgrounds. The animals must be sampled no more than seven (7) days prior to the date of arrival and a negative test record must be presented to Department or county fair staff upon request.

SWINE

Illinois Swine

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Brucellosis

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Pseudorabies

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Brucellosis

1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
2. Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

Pseudorabies

1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

Illinois Sheep

1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Sheep

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

Illinois Goats

1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Goats

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
2. Tuberculosis- Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Illinois Equine

1. All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POULTRY

1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be

negative to a test for *Mycoplasma gallisepticum* within 30 days prior to entry.

6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

CERVIDAE

(Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other Related Species)

Identification

All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique identifiers.

Illinois Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

For cervidae changing ownership or moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Department prior to movement and the cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number;
- Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cervidae. Out-of-State Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

1. All cervidae entering Illinois must be in compliance with the Illinois Wildlife Code [520 ILCS 5]. For more information, contact the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at 217/782-6384.
2. All cervidae entering Illinois must be accompanied by a permit from the Department and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that:
 - has been issued by an accredited veterinarian of the state of origin or a veterinarian in the employ of the United States Department of Agriculture;
 - is approved by the Animal Health Official of the state of origin;
 - shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the past five years);
 - shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or communicable disease;
 - shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.

3. A permit number can be obtained by applying online at <https://www2.illinois.gov/sites/agr/Animals/AnimalHealth/Documents/permitrequestform.pdf>.

Applicant for permit shall furnish the following information to the Department:

- Name and post office mailing address of Illinois destination;
- Name and post office mailing address of the consignor and/or source herds;
- Name and post office mailing address of the herd veterinarian;
- Number and unique identification of cervidae in shipment.

Brucellosis

Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry.

Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) single cervical tests for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry. These animals shall be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.

- Cervidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
- Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.

2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)

- All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
- The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional tuberculin tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to entry or exhibition.

RATITES

(Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis)

Illinois Ratites

There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

Out-of-State Ratites

1. Must be accompanied by a CVI and permit number. Entry permits are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>
2. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.
3. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry.

PIGEONS

There are no requirements governing the movements of pigeons within or into Illinois.

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

LLAMAS

There are no requirements governing the movement of llamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state llamas. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>

Livestock Regulations

The 2025 Fisher Community Fair is being conducted as an open show for all livestock exhibits, unless noted otherwise.

- Animals exhibited must be recorded with the respective breed associations in the name of the bonfire exhibitor to date of showing.
- Ownership: Animals owned in partnership may be entered in all classes in one owner's name, but must appear under but one owner-ship. The entry shall carry a footnote showing actual ownership of the animals as appearing upon the herd record books. Exhibitors in open classes must show all or part ownership of the animals shown.
- Exhibitors must furnish all water pails for watering of animals. No water tanks will be allowed. Each exhibitor must furnish his or her own feed for the necessary care of their animals.
- Awards will be made by single judge system. Placing will be final.
- 2 premiums collected per class per exhibitor.
- Registration and Health Certificates must be under the care of the person in charge of the exhibit. Both will accompany entries and be checked upon entry. Registration papers are required on steers.
- Exhibitors must submit their animals for examination by the veterinarian when so ordered by the superintendent of the department. No more than two entries in any class by one exhibitor. Each superintendent reserves the right to manage his or her show.
- The Fisher Community Fair will provide adequate police protection and take such precautionary measures as are consistent in the operation of the Fair. However, the Fair Board and the Fisher Community Fair and Horse Show will not be responsible to any person, individual, corporation, or association for any loss by either fire, theft, or personal injury sustained by anyone through the negligence of any person or group of persons, exhibits, or exhibitors.
- The directors of the Fisher Community Fair and Horse Show reserve the right to cancel the fair and withdraw all premiums offered should unforeseen circumstances occur which, in the judgment of the directors, would make it advisable to do so, and all premiums offered and contracts made shall be null and void.
- Exhibitors of livestock will be required to keep the stall in a neat and clean condition. All stall and pens must be cleaned daily.
- All Beef, Dairy Goats and Sheep are open classes unless otherwise noted.
- All livestock trailers enter through the south gate.
- All horse trailers use the north gate.
- Scales will be provided to weigh all market animals for proper placement. These weights are official.
- Only animals to be shown at the fair may be kept on the fair grounds.
- Scales will be provided to weigh all market animals for proper placement. These weights are official.
- Only animals to be shown at the fair may be kept on the fair grounds.
- Each individual is asked to cooperate in maintaining cleanliness in the barns and on the fairgrounds.
- All manure must be placed in provided marked areas.
- All grievances will be ruled on by the livestock superintendent and committee. Their decision is final.

- Beef tie-out areas will be east of the cattle barns. No exceptions.
- Each exhibitor is required to buy an Exhibitor Pass (\$15 each) at the time of entry, limit two per exhibitor.
- Campers will only be allowed south of the livestock barns.
- Tie outs and livestock trailers must be on the south east property line only.

False Pretense in Registration, Etc.

An act to punish false pretenses in obtaining certificates or registration of cattle and other animals, and to punish giving false pedigrees (Approved May 13, 1887, in force July 1, 1887, p.18)

- Penalty for obtaining certificate of registration by false pretense.
- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly: That any person who by any false pretense, shall obtain from any club, association, society, or company for improving the breed of cattle, horses, sheep, swine, or other domestic animals, a certificate of registration of any animal in the herd register or other register of any such club, association, society, or company, or a transfer of any such registration, and every person who shall knowingly give a false pedigree of any animal, upon conviction thereof shall be fined not exceeding \$1,000, nor less than \$25, or imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding one year, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Show Ring Code of Ethics

Believing it is in the best interest of all breeders of all livestock to maintain a reputation of integrity and to continue to present a wholesome and progressive image in the show ring, the following list of practices are considered unacceptable in the presentation of livestock. The use of such practices or procedures is, therefore, considered a violation of the Rules and Regulations governing this show.

- Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
- Treating or massaging any part of the body internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant or other substance to temporarily straighten a weak back or loin or to produce unnatural animation.
- Minimizing the effects of cramping by feeding or injecting drugs, depressants or applying packs or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment exempting normal exercise.
- Striking the animal to cause swelling or any other misuse of a drug of any kind, internally or externally.
- The use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or administered as a drench.
- Criticizing or interfering with the judge, or other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during or after the event may result in an individual or group being expelled, placed on probation, declared ineligible or barred from exhibiting at the event.

Any violation of the Rules and Regulations specifically designed for the individual shows or the "Show Ring Code of Ethics" may result in forfeiture of all premiums and awards, disqualification, expulsion or probation of the exhibitor, organized group and individual or livestock involved. Probation disqualification, expulsion or other disciplinary action of the Management will be final.

Such action will require application for readmission under such terms and the Management may prescribe before the group or individual is allowed to exhibit at future events.

The Fisher Community Fair is a member of the following show support organizations:

Violations at this show may affect the eligibility of the individual, group or sponsoring organization for participation at other shows that are also members of these organizations. The names of anyone in violation will be released to the other Fairs and Expositions.
