Mozart's is a place where everyone is welcome seven days a week from 7 a.m. to midnight.



Eclectic public art and soulful music, quirky boutiques and stunning natural beauty, and a whole world of epic eats — buckle up for a jampacked getaway to Austin.



#### **MORNING**

Start your day on the hip patio at **Paperboy** with fried chicken and a country biscuit. Or head to colorful **Vaquero Taquero** for slow-cooked barbacoa piled on handmade flour tortillas. Then, grab a free map — along with T-shirts and souvenirs — at the **Austin Visitor Center & Gift Shop** (moving to a new location in early 2025).

Next, do something uniquely Austin. On the **Austin Detours** Austin City Tour, you'll stop at iconic spots like the **"Greetings From Austin" mural**. Explore the **LBJ**  Presidential Library & Museum, complete with replica Oval Office and White House memorabilia. Or wander the Blanton Museum of Art galleries, with works ranging from classical to contemporary.

#### **AFTERNOON**

Get a pick-me-up at **Jo's Coffee**, such as the Iced Turbo with chocolate and hazelnut. Then,


snap a selfie at the "i love you so much" mural around the corner.

hip-hop to indie at ACL Live at The Moody Theater. Or head to Johnny Cash-themed Mean Eyed Cat for a "mean marg" and local bands.

Let your dancing shoes lead you to historic dance hall **Broken Spoke**, a local icon for 60 years.
Or boot scoot to honky-tonk **Little Longhorn Saloon**, a friendly dive inside a converted chapel.



#### **MORNING**

At bright **Café No Sé**, load up on colorful fare like the leek fritter or smoked salmon bagel. Or try the hearty croque madame on the sidewalk patio at Parisian bistro **June's All Day**.

Soak up the morning sun with a swim at **Barton Springs Pool**, fed by cool spring water. Or rent a beginner-friendly **stand-up**  **paddleboard** and glide along Lady Bird Lake under the city high-rises.

Then, hunt down some of Austin's best public art with an Instagrammable **self-guided mural tour**. As the afternoon fades, stroll along the **Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail** circling Lady Bird Lake.

#### **EVENING**

Laundromat-turned-cafe
Launderette boasts New American
dishes with global influences, like
shawarma cauliflower. At Asian

smokehouse **Loro**, Texas meats are enriched with flavors like yuzu and hoisin in a rustic-chic pavilion.

Spend the evening at **The Continental Club**, a haven for country, blues and rockabilly artists since the 1950s. Or relax at **The Saxon Pub**, an intimate listening room highlighting singersongwriters and rock bands.

Finish your day with mid-century-inspired tropical cocktails from immersive island bar **Tiki Tatsu-Ya**. At **Holiday** — Eater Austin's Best New Bar of 2023 — sip intriguing creations with bell pepper-infused sotol and chamomile scotch.

Legendary artists like Willie Nelson and Stevie Ray Vaughan put Austin's music scene on the map. Since then, the city has embraced live music of all genres. Whether you're looking for an EDM dance party, an up-and-coming indie band or a dance hall for two-stepping, you'll find it in music-loving Austin.

#### **ROCK/ALTERNATIVE**

All are welcome at **Mohawk** in the Red River Cultural District. Their indoor and outdoor stages host local and national indie acts across genres.

Auto shop-turned-venue Empire Control Room & Garage has three distinct stages for acts large and small. Check out theme nights like reggaeton and queer joy dance parties.

In East Austin, the **Historic Scoot Inn** has been serving up beer and music since 1871. Catch indie acts in an old-school Western dive.

Wide-open warehouse **Emo's** offers great sightlines from every corner. Multiple bars make it

easy to get a drink at shows ranging from pop to metal.

The outdoor amphitheater at **Stubb's Bar-B-Q** is one of the larger downtown venues, packing in up to 2,500 people. Come early for preshow brisket.

Divey cocktail lounge **The Volstead** hosts local DJs for eclectic dance parties. Adjoining club **Hotel Vegas** welcomes punk and alternative bands on their intimate indoor stage. The two venues share a backyard and outdoor stage for larger concerts under the stars.

The energy is high at tiny **Chess Club**, where audiences pack in elbow-to-elbow to catch bands performing everything from folk music to metal.

Rock and roll, plus great drinks, are the draws at **The 13th Floor**, a Red River neighborhood bar and live music venue.

#### **BLUES/SOUL**

Legends like Ray Charles, James Brown and Bonnie Raitt have graced the stage at Antone's Nightclub, a blues mainstay since 1975. Stop by the on-site box office and retail store Big Henry's Vinyl & Gifts to shop soul, funk and blues records.

Offbeat dive **The Skylark Lounge** maintains old Austin cool. Grab a





booth and catch local blues and soul acts on the corner stage.

Vintage-inspired **King Bee** hums with live music three nights a week. Sip a frozen Bee's Knees cocktail with a bluesy soundtrack in this neighborhood staple.

Welcoming **C-Boy's Heart & Soul** keeps classic soul and R&B alive every night. Hit the small dance floor or cozy up in a booth to soak up the music.

and Nicki Minaj, as well as the CMT Music Awards.

The eclectic ACL Live at The Moody Theater could welcome Bob Dylan one evening and a B-52s cover band the next at 3TEN downstairs. Enter to win free passes to an Austin City Limits taping, the longest-running music series on television.

Dance parties, drag shows and indie bands set the scene at queer club **Cheer Up Charlies**. Be yourself at this creative and colorful hangout.

The Continental Club has been a neighborhood staple since 1955. With an intimate stage, dim lights and diverse acts, this Austin landmark retains its old-school cool.

In South Austin, **The Far Out Lounge & Stage** hosts a variety
of bands and weekend music
festivals on its outdoor stage.
Food trucks and cold beer
make it a backyard party.

Explore three levels of music at **Speakeasy**, including the Roaring '20s-style Music Lounge, The Ballroom at Speakeasy featuring weekly '80s tribute bands, and the Rooftop with DJs and city views.

Celebrating 50 years, **Hole in the Wall** is a beloved local dive with
6+ hours of daily music and a list of
celebrity sightings a mile long.

Now in a new eastside location, Parish presents a wide spectrum of entertainment, from disco parties to very adult bingo. Around the corner, an alley entrance leads to My Oh My, a hi-fi listening lounge with inventive DJ sets and draft cocktails.

**Moody Amphitheater** at the newly revamped Waterloo Park welcomes national acts and local festivals.

#### **JAZZ**

With brick walls and a low ceiling, basement club **The Elephant Room** feels like a secret getaway. At the back, a small stage hosts live jazz nightly.

Parker Jazz Club was built for music. Every aspect of this underground listening room was carefully crafted for sound quality — designed by musicians, for musicians.

You can bring your own drinks to the living room-style **Monks Jazz Club**. This listening room has a "no talking" policy so the crowd can focus on the music.

#### **POP & ECLECTIC**

The biggest names in music stop at the **Moody Center**. Opened in 2022, this 15,000-person arena has hosted acts like Chris Stapleton



Picnic on the grassy lawn in view of the Capitol dome.

On Sunday, **The 04 Center**'s 1960s A-frame building serves as a church. But during the rest of the week, it's a one-of-a-kind music venue welcoming acts of all genres.

#### LATIN/WORLD MUSIC

Explore the wide world of global music at family-owned **Sahara Lounge**. Line up at the free buffet and dance to Afrobeat music at Africa Night every Saturday.

The small space at **Flamingo Cantina** is known for premium sound quality. Laid-back reggae, high-energy hip-hop and rhythmic Latin artists radiate good vibes.

#### **ACOUSTIC**

The cozy **Cactus Cafe** has been a University of Texas fixture since 1979. Spot soon-to-be-greats at this casual 150-seat listening room.

An estimated 30,000 performances have graced the stage at **The Saxon Pub** since 1990. Bands start at happy hour and go late nearly every night.

Home to nonprofit Austin Classical Guitar, **The Rosette** highlights local and international guitar music. The theater's warm acoustics enhance everything from folk tunes to flamenco.





#### COUNTRY/ AMERICANA

The Texas country acts at hip honky-tonk **The White Horse** draw a faithful crowd. Come early for two-step lessons Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Once a chapel, **The Little Longhorn Saloon** still boasts a white steeple. But you're more likely to find twangy guitars than hymns in this tiny honky-tonk.

The Man in Black lives on at Johnny Cash-themed bar **Mean Eyed Cat**. Despite the name, it's a friendly gem with bluegrass, Americana and Cash tribute bands.

Boot scoot and two-step at **Broken Spoke**, Austin's oldest dance hall and a Texas Historic Landmark. If you're a newbie, take a quick dance lesson before the band starts.

Once a train station, **Donn's Depot** is now the place to move your caboose. This piano bar has been rockin' and rollin' for nearly 50 years.

At South Austin's **Sagebrush**, an indoor sunset evokes the open country of West Texas. Take to the roomy dance floor under an enormous vaulted ceiling.

#### DANCE

Climb to the rooftop of LGBTQ+ Coconut Club for DJ sets under the city skyline. Next door, sister club Neon Grotto hosts dance parties with a tropical vibe under the glow of neon lights. Theme nights reign supreme at **Barbarella**, with weekly events like TuezGayz, '80s night and emo night. Adjoining venue **Swan Dive** rollicks with DJ sets, drag shows and creative artists in a sprawling warehouse.

Join the dancing at EDM club Vulcan Gas Company or watch the action from the second-floor mezzanine. With two bars and a roof terrace, there's space here to spread out.

**Elysium Nightclub** is an alternative enclave. With industrial DJs, bands that defy classification and the annual goth prom, this is where misfits fit right in.

Parties go late at **Kingdom**, a weekend-only club with shows until 4 a.m. Look for the red door in the alley to find high-energy EDM and vivid light displays.

With an 18,000-square-foot main room and an adjoining field, **The Concourse Project** is one of Austin's largest dance venues for house, EDM, techno and more.

At Emmer & Rye, JBA finalist Kevin Fink focuses on heirloom grains and handmade pastas. The cacio e pepe is a local legend. Fink's upscale Hestia spotlights live-fire cooking, with dishes finished on a 20-foot open hearth. Stop by Hestia Bar for classic martinis and the raw bar.

At Comedor, Texas Monthly's 2020 Best New Restaurant, you'll find modern Mexican dishes like dryaged ribeye with chilhuacle negro butter, plus plenty of mezcals and tequilas. Feast on modern Southern cuisine and perfect flaky biscuits at Olamaie. This inviting house-turned restaurant boasts Food & Wine's Best New Chef nod and multiple JBA nominations. El Naranjo offers authentic Mexican cuisine like rich moles and heirloom corn tortillas,



thanks to JBA Best Chef: Texas winner Iliana de la Vega.

JBA-nominated chef Damien
Brockway of food truck **Distant Relatives** serves modern African
American cuisine by way of
barbecue. Try the pulled pork with
tamarind molasses barbecue sauce.
Fish is imported from Tokyo daily at
sushi favorite **Uchi**, helmed by JBA
Best Chef: Southwest winner Tyson
Cole. Savor traditional nigiri and hot
bites in this converted bungalow.

New Caribbean **Canje** takes inspiration from Guyana and nearby islands, with dishes like cod fritters with habanero and mango. Sip elevated rum cocktails at this 2022 *Eater* award winner, whose co-owner Tavel Bristol-Joseph was nominated for the 2024 JBA Best Chef: Texas. **Suerte**'s traditional

Mexican dishes seem simple, but every seasonally driven plate delivers thanks to their JBA-nominated chef, Fermín Núñez. Be sure to try the suadero tacos.

Menus change daily at **Birdie's**, a counter service eatery from 2024 JBA Best Chef: Texas finalist Tracy Malechek-Ezekiel. Share Europeaninspired small plates and a bottle from their extensive wine list. Food truck **Con Todo** serves up pollo en mole and loaded nopalitos tacos, inspired by JBA-nominated chef Joseph Gomez's roots in the Rio Grande Valley.

JBA 2024 Best New Restaurant nominee and 2023 Eater award winner Ramen del Barrio combines tonkotsu pork broth, chewy noodles and slow-cooked carnitas for a unique Japanese-Mexican fusion.

The sandwiches at Mum Foods Smokehouse & Delicatessen are piled high with homesmoked brisket, sausage and turkey. Pair yours with matzo ball soup by chef Geoff Ellis, a 2024 Best Chef: Texas JBA nominee.

#### **AUSTIN STAPLES**

Joe's Bakery & Coffee Shop has been serving all-day Tex-Mex diner breakfast and sweet conchas since 1962, earning a 2023 James Beard America's Classics award. Even older is **Scholz Garten** (established 1866), with hearty German sausages and plenty of cold drafts in an old-fashioned beer hall.

You'll know you've reached Franklin Barbecue by the line outside. But the infamously tender brisket by JBA winner Aaron Franklin is worth the wait. Beloved barbecue truck LeRoy & Lewis has a new brick-and-mortar in South Austin, featuring pulled whole hog and weekend specials like Friday beef cheeks.

Watch the chefs at work in Foreign & Domestic's open kitchen. The European-inspired menu features farm-to-table, nose-to-tail seasonal fare from local farmers. The tortillas are

the stars at Food & Wine 2020 Best New Restaurant Nixta Taqueria. JBA Emerging Chef winner Edgar Rico serves duck carnitas tacos on house-made Oaxacan corn tortillas.

The rich pork broth and slurpable noodles at hip Ramen Tatsu-ya are true Japanese comfort food. Customize your bowl with nori or a flavor bomb. Everything's bigger at Banger's Sausage House & Beer Garden, with over 200 draft beers, hearty sausages and a whole-hog roast every Saturday.

A mainstay since 1952, Matt's El Rancho whips up delicious Tex-Mex in a colorful hacienda with a beautiful patio. Their Bob Armstrong Dip and margaritas are must-tries. Pick a platter of lean brisket, beef ribs or sausage at The County Line Bar-B-Q. Or order family style — the meat will keep coming until you've had your fill.

Veracruz All Natural food trucks whip up delicious street tacos with organic ingredients. Get a fresh-squeezed juice on the side for a vitamin boost. The Detroit-style pizzas at Via 313 food trucks have thick, chewy dough made in rectangular steel pans — the perfect base for gooey cheese and smoked pepperoni.



#### **WHAT'S NEW**

NADC Burger's wagyu smashburger is the brainchild of a pro skater and Michelin chef. Get it at their brick-and-mortar on East Sixth or check out other locations around town.

All-day Italian cafe **Poeta** at **The Frances Modern Inn** is all about simple excellence. Think perfect al dente pasta and pillowy gnocchi in a cozy, old-school dining room.

Craft Omakase's 22-course seasonal tasting menu is a lesson in precision. Each bite highlights exceptional ingredients like delicate nigiri and dry-aged fish in a 12-seat dining room.

European bistro **Gina's on Congress** blends classic and
contemporary, like smoked
salmon dip with sea salt potato
chips. Negroni lovers can choose
from seven variations.

Explore Laotian American food at East Austin's **Lao'd Bar**. You'll find pulled pork steam buns and crispy fried rice, plus rice lagers and cocktails.

In the historic Littlefield Building, **Mexta** offers high-end, modern Mexican. Look for colorful dishes like the masa tetela with rich mole, pork belly cracklings and grilled avocado.

The shopping strip locale of **Endo** belies the meticulous 20-course omakase experience within. Traditional techniques like salt curing, dry aging and smoking highlight exceptional ingredients.

Casual bar and burger joint **Redbud Ice House** dishes American wagyu cheeseburgers and cold 18-oz. beers on an expansive patio with picnic tables.

Old-school American and Texan fare gets a fresh look at **The Statesman**, with wagyu strip steaks and decadent charcuterie. Press the champagne button for a bubbly delivery.

Mathew Peters, the first American chef to win the prestigious Bocuse d'Or international cooking competition, presents luxurious cocktails and canapés at highend lounge **Prélude**. This is just the beginning — a full restaurant called **Maven** is due in 2025.

Cold microbrews, hot pizza and local music combine at **The Austin Beer Garden Brewing Co.**'s spacious warehouse. Hophead favorite **Austin Beerworks** offers easy-drinking standard and seasonal brews, plus disc golf, at their new Sprinkle Valley location.

Try Austin's original craft beer at Belgian-style **Celis Brewery**. Outside, play cornhole and find food truck eats at **CTX Beer Garden**. A World War II-era machine shop retains its industrial vibe at **Central Machine Works**, serving traditional IPAs, lagers and elevated cocktails.

Jester King Brewery's 41-acre farm is a countryside getaway, with farmhouse beers, woodfired pizza and playful goats. You'll find a mellow beer garden and hot chicken food truck Spicy Boys at both locations of St. Elmo Brewing Co.

At urban brewery **Zilker Brewing Company**, bring your pale ale to the patio and soak up East Austin cool. Hill Country destination **Vista Brewing** uses limestone-filtered water sourced on-site — perfect for a day relaxing under the live oaks.



New spot **Fast Friends Brewing** embraces styles from hops to wheat to kettle sours in South Austin.

#### **DISTILLERIES**

The only saké distiller in the state, **Texas Saké Company** brews both classic and contemporary flavored sakés. Sample small-batch spirits over lazy-day lawn games at **Dripping Springs Distilling**.

Still Austin Whiskey Co. specializes in true Texas bourbon, made with 100% state-grown grains and a 42-foot column still. Deep Eddy Vodka was designed for Austin summers, with fresh flavors like peach, ruby red grapefruit and sweet tea.

The elegant tasting room, fivestory rickhouse and sunset views make the whiskey taste even better at **Fierce Whiskers Distillery**. Mezcal fan? Then you'll love the sotol at Southwestern-chic **Desert** 



Door Distillery, made from wildharvested Texas sotol plants. At Treaty Oak Distilling, the 28acre ranch boasts a music stage, whiskey tastings and Southern barbecue at Alice's Restaurant.

#### **WINERIES**

Don't miss the 100% Texas Tempranillo at award-winning **C.L. Butaud**, now located in the St. Elmo district. Nearby, **The Austin Winery** uses top Texas fruit in its bottles. Sip among the kegs in their urban tasting room.

Choose from dozens of self-pour wines on tap at Wanderlust Wine Co. Visit all three tasting room locations, including an underground wine cave speakeasy. Wine for the People in Fredericksburg highlights top boutique Texas wines. See 15 Central Texas & Hill Country Day Trips at the back of this guide for more Hill Country wineries.



















In Zilker Park, **Barton Springs Pool** is an oasis in the middle of the city. Clear spring water feeds this 3-acre pool, keeping the temp a brisk 68° to 70° year-round. Cool off by day or take a moonlight swim under the glow of distant city lights (hours vary seasonally).

- Nrause Springs








#### **HIKING**

You'll find many of Austin's outdoor enthusiasts at the **Barton Creek Greenbelt**. This expansive urban green space is home to seasonal swimming holes and waterfalls, natural caves and scenic overlooks. Explore it all over 12+ miles of trails, from family-friendly routes to more challenging terrain like the steep Hill of Life.

- Milton Reimers Ranch Park





The elbows are out at Texas Roller Derby (TXRD), a seven-team league of





Satisfy everyone at upscale food hall **Fareground**, with four dining options and two bars. Grab a spicy margarita or espresso martini at outdoor bar and patio **Ellis**.


#### **NIGHTLIFE**

A night at **Speakeasy** means live music and DJs, bowling, pool and a rooftop patio. Beer aficionados will love **Mort Subite**, a Belgian beer bar with dozens of witbiers and saisons.

The classic cocktails at speakeasy **Small Victory** earned them a place among *Esquire*'s 50 Best Martinis in America. Subterranean club **The Elephant Room** hosts nightly jazz in a brick-lined cellar.

A night at **Higher Ground** is a religious experience, with cocktails inspired by the seven deadly sins. Colorful disco cocktails at retrothemed **Saturn Cocktail Club** blend Day-Glo colors and premium ingredients.

Party without the hangover at alcohol-free **Sans Bar** with mocktails, music and trivia (open Friday nights only).





#### **ATTRACTIONS**

Explore the captivating world of modern art at The Contemporary Austin – Jones Center. Mexic-Arte Museum highlights Mexican and Latin artists, and hosts an annual Día de los Muertos celebration.

Tour the **Texas State Capitol** — it's the biggest capitol building in the country. Walk the winding paths of **Waterloo Park** and catch a show at its 5,000-seat **Moody Amphitheater**.


#### **OUTDOORS**

Lady Bird Lake brings calm to the commotion of the city with canoeing and stand-up paddleboarding. Walk and talk on the **Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail** circling the

free-tailed bats emerge at sunset

## RAINEY STREET

Bungalows-turned-bars border luxury high-rises in this one-of-akind entertainment district. Dine with award-winning chefs, quaff creative cocktails and party the night away on offbeat Rainey Street.

#### **DINING**

The casual **Tómalo Taqueria** specializes in tacos, along with grilled fish and vegetables. Quench your thirst with a mezcal cocktail. Enjoy dinner with a show at **Geraldine's** at **Hotel Van Zandt**, featuring live music nightly. Dig into a Texas-style, dry-aged cowboy steak under stunning arched ceiling beams.

Menus change daily at farmforward **Emmer & Rye**. Look for pillowy handmade French ravioli or broad pappardelle ribbons. Tropical **Anthem** serves a mash-up of Latin, Asian and Texas flavors, like honey sriracha popcorn chicken with a Hong Kong waffle and white shoyu gravy.

Find classic kielbasa, spicy drunk chicken and even vegetarian sausages at **Banger's Sausage House & Beer Garden**. Pick a beer from 200+ drafts and relax on the timber porch. There are only two options at **NADC Burger** inside **Idle Hands** — a 100% Texas wagyu smashburger and a side of fries, each done to impeccable cooking standards.

Start or end your night at **Salvation Pizza**, open until 2 a.m. on weekends. Their crispy thin crust holds up to toppings like truffles, spinach and mushrooms.

#### **NIGHTLIFE**

Cozy bungalow **Half Step** whips up modern takes on classic cocktails. They're serious about ice, using house-filtered water in their giant cubes or crushed ice. Outside, food truck **Little Lucy's** 





**Mini Donuts** fries doughy treats with flavors like blueberry and lemongrass.

The vibes are relaxed at Lucille Patio Lounge with shaded hammocks, oversized lawn games and fresh cocktails made with Texas spirits. "Here, everything is good" boasts a neon sign (in French) at Lustre Pearl. Play pingpong outside or climb to the rooftop for downtown views. Clive Bar's personality changes from day to night. Sip a refreshing paloma on the sunny rooftop or hit the dance floor after dark.

Icenhauer's pulses with weekly entertainment, from live band karaoke to high-energy cover bands to resident DJs. Housemade liquor infusions make their cocktails pop. You never know what you'll find at "party closet" Little Brother Bar — an unannounced punk show, a speedwalking competition or a smashburger pop-up.

The cocktails are light and bright at **Augustine**, made from fresh juices and local spirits for low-sugar goodness in an 1889 bungalow. Trendy **Parlor Room** welcomes live bands and genre-crossing DJ residencies to make every weekend a party. People watch on the front patio or hit the dance floor out back.

For a taste of island life on Rainey Street, head to Idle Hands. Their Caribbeaninspired cocktails and frozen drinks feature flavors like guava, grapefruit and pineapple. Old-fashioned shuffleboard gets the nightlife treatment at Electric Shuffle. High-tech tables keep score while you savor a frozen Aperol spritz.

## EXPERIENCE AUSTIN'S LATIN CULTURE

Walk the Tejano Trails to visit 20+ cultural sites, including the newly renovated Emma S. **Barrientos Mexican American** Cultural Center (MACC). reopening in 2025. On-site theater **Teatro Vivo** produces Latin plays and performances. The Rancho Alegre Conjunto Music Festival highlights Teiano and conjunto artists. Browse pop-up market Frida Friday ATX, centered on women of color creators. Music and dance shine at the Puerto Rican Cultural Center. Go to visitaustin.org/corazon for more ideas.







DOWNTOWN

# RED RIVER CULTURAL DISTRICT

Austin's soundtrack plays on in the Red River Cultural District. Discover live bands of all genres and energetic dance parties in this electrifying musical neighborhood.

#### DINING

Fuel up before the show. At Asian fusion **Koriente**, dishes are lighter — try the Mixmix Bibimbap packed with veggies. Dine in at New York-style **Hoboken Pie**, or grab a foldable slice to-go at their walk-up window.

Moonshine Patio Bar & Grill serves Southern comfort food and a buffet brunch inside an 1850s dry goods store. In the stone cellar, sip fine spirits and premium cocktails at Kinfolk Lounge & Library.

Pelón's Tex-Mex Restaurant ticks every box with carnitas enchiladas, margarita flights and a beautiful multilevel patio. Next door, try classic cocktails with a mezcal twist at Bar 508 Mezcalerita, like the Oaxaca old fashioned. And get flame-seared al pastor or pulled chicken tinga tacos on house-made tortillas from Vaquero Taquero.

## LIVE MUSIC & NIGHTLIFE

Barbecue joint/music venue **Stubb's Bar-B-Q** can fit up to 2,500 people in its outdoor amphitheater. Rock club **Mohawk** has two stages, three bars and a roof deck that overlooks the district.

A large garage door lifts to merge the indoors and outdoors at three-stage **Empire Control Room & Garage**. Creativity reigns at **Swan Dive**, home to burlesque, drag, comedy and performance art of all stripes.

Counterculture oasis **Elysium Nightclub** has been a welcoming haven for genre-defying artists







since 2001. At **Cheer Up Charlies**, pop culture theme parties, drag shows and LGBTQ+ performances make everyone feel welcome.

Topping best dance club lists since 2009, **Barbarella** parties like TuezGayz and Y2K night are always packed. Three dance floors pulse with perreo under a neon glow at Latin club **Mala Vida**.

Comedy club The Creek & The Cave spotlights big names and aspiring comics from an intimate stage. Diminutive Chess Club brings epic energy with bands from folk to thrash, plus tasty affordable cocktails. Inspired by Austin's 1970s psychedelic scene, rock club The 13th Floor keeps the local nightlife culture alive and well.

#### **INSIDER TIP**

Each July, Red River comes together to host **Hot Summer Nights**, a free three-day music festival. Explore the district's top venues and support 100+ local and national artists.

## SECOND STREET

Walk the tree-lined sidewalks of Second Street for boutique shopping, margarita-ready patios and one of Austin's favorite live music venues — all within a few city blocks.

#### **DINING**

Mexican is on the menu! At contemporary La Condesa, sample a massive tequila selection and Mexico Citystyle small plates like bluefin tuna crudo. The fresh flavors of ATX Cocina are meant to be shared — try the short rib with smoky mole coloradito.

On **Austin Proper Hotel**'s fifth floor, poolside **La Piscina** dishes Gulf seafood and six types of fajitas. Visit the **Polvos** patio in the trees for ceviche and tamales, flautas and enchiladas, plus frozen margs.

Barbecue goes bougie at upscale-rustic **Lamberts**. Devour slow-smoked pork ribs with aji amarillo, plus sample one of 50+ whiskeys. The walk-up window at **Jo's Coffee** serves cold brew to-go. Or sit inside the light-filled cafe and dine on breakfast tacos.

Classy neighborhood diner Bill's Oyster wows with fresh oysters, caviar and seafood towers, plus New Orleans-inspired cocktails. Enjoy sustainable seafood or energizing cold-pressed juices at farm-to-table The Well, with bohochic vibes. At modern Chinese RedFarm, feast on creative dim sum and updated classics — the Peking duck is a standout.

#### **SHOPPING**

Window shop the **2ND Street District** boutiques overflowing
with uniquely Austin finds. Browse
Tito's Vodka merch at the **Love**, **Tito's** souvenir shop, including
apparel, barware and pup
products (no vodka sold here!).



Look for music-themed art and band T-shirts for adults and kids at **Austin Rocks!** to get concert-ready. Jewelry boutique **Eliza Page** curates luxurious pieces by skilled artisans and creates their own designs, including engagement rings.

Imagination station **Toy Joy** overflows with educational games and science kits, stuffed animals and offbeat collectibles. Stock up on eats at **Royal Blue Grocery**.

Get grab-and-go snacks, fresh produce, and beer and wine.

Upgrade your closet at **Second Street Boutique**, featuring local and Texas designers along with home decor and gifts. Footwear micro-chain **Sneaker Politics** keeps feet looking fierce. Check out the athletic and stylish kicks, including hard-to-find styles.



#### **INSIDER TIP**

Soak up music culture with eclectic concerts ranging from Olivia Rodrigo to Ringo Starr at ACL Live at The Moody Theater. Famed television show Austin City Limits celebrates 50 years in 2024; enter the lottery for a chance to attend a free taping. The 90-minute ACL Live Venue Tour takes you behind the scenes of the music show, with iconic photography and memorable stories.



Set on 1,500 acres in the rolling hills just outside downtown Austin, Circuit of The Americas has hosted the biggest names in racing, action sports, and music since 2012.

## SIXTH STREET

However you like to let loose, historic Sixth Street is the place to do it. High-energy nightclubs, secret speakeasies and no-holdsbarred comedy clubs make this an entertainment epicenter.

#### DINING

Come hungry to dive bar Casino El Camino, where a punk rock soundtrack accompanies Angus beef burgers. People watch from the rooftop patio at Iron Cactus, serving up inventive Tex-Mex like Mexican meatloaf and Southwest paella, along with more than 100 tequilas.

Gastropub **Parkside** is back after an 18-month renovation. Drop by on Oyster & Bubbles Wednesday for half-price oysters and champagne. Around the back, sister restaurant **the backspace** cooks perfectly crisp Neapolitan pizzas on a woodfired oven.

As Downtown Austin's only brewery, **Central District Brewing** brews up variety. Sip sours, stouts and IPAs in their modern industrial space.

#### **NIGHTLIFE**

The Driskill hotel has held court on Sixth Street since 1886. Inside, The Driskill Bar is old-school Texas, with gleaming wood, leather armchairs and an extensive whiskey selection.

Maggie Mae's is a sprawling nightlife destination with five bars, three stages and a rooftop deck. Dance to salsa, Latin and reggaeton music at Cielo Nightclub, where neon lights energize the dance floor. Iconic blues venue Antone's Nightclub has welcomed legends like B.B. King and Ray Charles, plus fostered new talent on their way to greatness.

Soak up the positive energy at eclectic **Flamingo Cantina**, where live bands play Latin, reggae, ska and world beats. At Oaxaca-style











bar Las Perlas, choose from over 400 small-batch tequilas, mezcals and sotols. Grab slow-cooked pork carnitas tacos from the Asador Tacos food truck to accompany your flight.

The nation's longest-running musical revue is **Esther's Follies**, an everchanging variety show of comedy, magic and music. At Irish pub **The Dead Rabbit** enjoy properly poured Guinness, Irish coffee and plenty of Irish whiskey.

Inside the historic Ritz building, Comedy Mothership hosts big name and up-and-coming comedians. Catch more comedy at Vulcan Gas Company, plus occasional EDM shows and dance parties, in sleek industrial digs. Can you find these Sixth Street speakeasies? Enter former brothel Midnight Cowboy under the red light for adventurous creations like dragon tea-infused tequila. Reservations required! To find Firehouse Lounge, move the sliding bookcase in the hostel lobby to reveal an Old World-meets-Austin scene.

In an alley, unmarked purple doors guard **Eden Cocktail Room**. You'll lose track of time in this dimly lit space over botanical-forward drinks. Enter the code to access reservation-only **Here Nor There**. Once you're inside, you'll discover an intimate basement bar with handcrafted seasonal cocktails.

#### **INSIDER TIP**

Browse oddities and curios at the Museum of the Weird, dedicated to all things strange. Look for real shrunken heads, mummies, movie memorabilia, and unusual taxidermy like the legendary Fiji mermaid. Take your time — there are treasures and ephemera in every corner.





#### DOWNTOWN

# WAREHOUSE DISTRICT

Once an industrial zone, the Warehouse District is now a place to play. Get ready for an all-night celebration thanks to upscale dining, lively cocktail bars and LGBTQ+ nightclubs.

#### DINING

Pasta is handmade daily at Italian **Red Ash**, but dry-aged steaks finished on a wood-fired grill are an even bigger draw. Snack on French comfort food at Parisian-chic **Péché**, and be sure to sample an herbal absinthe from their extensive menu.

At **Hestia**, the chefs finish nearly everything from Texas wagyu to crisped cabbage on a 20-foot open flame hearth. The new **Hestia Bar** offers elevated bites plus luxurious cocktails. Try the Hestia martini — dry gin with house-made beef aminos.

Overlooking the seventh-floor pool of **Hotel ZaZa**, **Group Therapy** dazzles with elegant chandeliers and unique art. The red winebraised short ribs are a standout. At modern Mexican **Comedor**, pair the bone marrow tacos with a smoky mezcal cocktail under enormous industrial windows.

The dishes at inviting **Ember Kitchen** are cooked in a special charcoal oven, leaving entrees like the orange-and-guajillo chicken juicy and tender. Downstairs, **Subterra Agave Bar** reimagines classic cocktails with Latin spirits. Try the mai tai with charanda, a Mexican sugar cane spirit.



#### LGBTQ+-FRIENDLY CLUBS

Catch drag shows and theme nights at oversized **Highland Lounge**. Popular spot **Rain on 4th** is one of *Esquire*'s Best Gay Bars in America (2023). **Oilcan Harry's** dance floor has shimmered since 1990. Hit the laser-lit party at **Coconut Club**, or pop next door to fluorescent **Neon Grotto**. **The Iron Bear** welcomes all with a burger and a beer. Find more ideas at **visitaustin.org/lgbtq** 

Trendy social lounge **Estelle's** eschews minimalism for bold prints and vibrant colors. Savor a matcha martini on the intimate first floor, or head upstairs for DJs and dancing. At **The Roosevelt Room**, sip your way through drinking eras, from the late-19th century to today. Creative presentations are part of the fun.

The events at **The Courtyard ATX** range from rock bands to drag shows, emo night to DJ sets, all in a covered courtyard.

#### **INSIDER TIP**

Each Saturday, browse the stalls of fresh produce, pasture-raised meat, artisan spreads and baked goods at SFC Farmers' Market Downtown in Republic Square. Food booths and live music make it a festival!











#### **DOWNTOWN**

# WEST SIXTH STREET

Upscale dining and global cuisines. Hidden speakeasies and cozy dives. High-end galleries and hip independent shops. It all comes together in this one eclectic neighborhood.

#### DINING

Bask in the warm hospitality at Fixe Southern House, with hearty heritage pork chops and perfectly flaky biscuits. The all-day breakfast at 1950s-style 24 Diner boasts golden eggs and veggie options. Enjoy brunch with a pitcher of sangria in the open-air courtyard at Verbena, located on the ground level of the Canopy by Hilton Austin Downtown.

**TenTen**'s modern Japanese menu includes fresh sushi and sashimi, plus meats grilled over hot charcoal. Explore all eight traditional Chinese food traditions at **Wu Chow**, from Anhui to Zhejiang.

Get Tex-Mex favorites at casual El Arroyo. The famous and funny marquee out front changes daily. Don't miss the soup dumplings at Lin Asian Bar + Dim Sum, filled with rich broth and savory pork.

Whether raw or cooked, the seafood at Clark's Oyster Bar goes best with bubbles. Opulent J. Carver's Oyster Bar & Chop House fires up wood-grilled steaks and succulent seafood.

The vibes at **Taquero Mucho** are all pink — from the dining room to cocktails to tortillas. Sit at the counter of **Garbo's on Lamar** to order your lobster roll Connecticut or Maine style. Seasonal **Pecan Square Cafe** combines California, Texas and Mediterranean flavors in warm wood surroundings.

#### **INSIDER TIP**

Charming doesn't begin to describe Walton's Fancy & Staple, a combination bakery, flower shop and deli. Grab a table to dine on challah French toast or a fresh caprese sandwich, and don't skip the macarons. Then, browse gifts like candles and house plants in the brick-walled bistro.

#### **NIGHTLIFE**

West Sixth Street fixture **Star Bar** is a game day destination, with 14 TVs and two patios. Folksy **Rustic Tap** brings cold beer and hot music to the neighborhood nightly.

Grab a seat on the shady patio at friendly **Mean Eyed Cat** for refreshing cocktails. Cocktails meet concrete at **Garage**, a luxe speakeasy tucked into a parking garage.

Sip morning coffee and unique post-work cocktails at pretty all-day cafe **Better Half Coffee & Cocktails**. Next door, sample the IPAs and lagers at **Hold Out Brewing** inside a refurbished Quonset hut.

Savory tacos and Asian-inspired eats pair with zesty cocktails at inviting **Bar Peached**. Narrow neighborhood dive **Dirty Bill's** has club energy with a fraction of the space.

Live jazz and R&B set the mood at swanky underground **Devil May Care.** West Texas disco **Wiggle Room** blends a retro vibe with live music and DJ sets.

Sip whiskey and snack on a Chicago dog at upscale neighborhood pub **Howards Bar and Club**. Out back, relax with natural wines and European small bites on the welcoming patio at **Rosie's Wine Bar**.

#### **SHOPPING**

Grab a coffee at **BookPeople**, Texas' largest independent bookstore, and stick around for an author reading. Luxe boutique **ByGeorge** offers premium men's and women's apparel, as well as jewelry and home decor.

Find new releases and used LPs at Waterloo Records. You may catch an in-store performance. Go beyond groceries at Whole Foods Market flagship — enjoy sushi, a casual bar and frequent live music.

Historic Clarksville is a gallery goldmine. Lotus Gallery highlights Asian art and antiquities from centuries past. At West Chelsea Contemporary, browse museumstyle exhibits from major names to emerging artists. An elegant old house is home to Stephen L. Clark Gallery, specializing in fine art photography and collages. And the Wally Workman Gallery supports a variety of dynamic artists in multiple media.



# CENTRAL AUSTIN

Funky boutiques, relaxed eateries and historic music venues — plus the melting pot of The University of Texas at Austin campus — make Central Austin one of the city's most culturally-forward districts.

#### **DINING**

Dig into hefty beef ribs or tender brisket at **Stiles Switch BBQ**. It's always 1971 at old-school carhop **Top Notch**, with char-broiled burgers and milkshakes.

Casual Japanese Komé Sushi Kitchen slices up authentic sushi and perfect bento boxes. Rustic-chic Barley Swine works with local farmers to keep their rotating dishes fresh.

Savor Interior Mexican cuisine (and excellent tres leches) at elegant hacienda **Fonda San Miguel**. Feast under greenery at **Lutie's Garden Restaurant**, with colorful dishes and delicate seafood.

Quaint French bistro **épicerie** dishes a daily quiche and fluffy beignets. **Bird Bird Biscuit**'s crispy fried chicken and flaky buttermilk biscuits top local best-of lists.

Scoop up traditional spiced doro wot with pillowy injera at **Aster's Ethiopian Restaurant**. The flapjacks at **JP's Pancake Company** can be a sweet or savory treat.

Garden cafe **Tiny Boxwoods** whips up fresh fare like bright panzanella salads. Order chewy chocolate chip cookies from walk-up **Tiny's Milk** and **Cookies**.

Greek **Yamas** is a Mediterranean spot with fresh seafood and traditional moussaka. **Les Bobos Crepes** are stuffed with gruyere or Nutella, then wrapped for easy eating.

Comfort food goes meat-free at Arlo's Curbside food truck, located at The Ballroom at Spider House, with bites like the popular Bac'n Cheeze Burger.





#### **NIGHTLIFE**

Live music venue Hole in the Wall is a laid-back dive for laid-back nights. Two-step at The Little Longhorn Saloon, or test your luck with Chicken Sh\*t Bingo hosted every Sunday.

Easy Tiger at The Linc pours Texas drafts in a sprawling beer garden. Bring your favorite tabletop game to Vigilante Gastropub & Games for pub fare and themed cocktails.

Every day is Christmas at Lala's Little Nugget, with festive lights and holiday decor. Whimsical Carousel Lounge sports circus-themed murals and a very pink elephant.

**Hopfields** is casual yet elevated, with craft beer and French wines in a welcoming brasserie. Catch world-

class musicians and comedy stars at the 15,000-capacity **Moody Center**.

#### **ARTS**

Get your culture fix at The University of Texas at Austin (UT). The Art Galleries at Black Studies spotlight modern art from across the African diaspora. The Harry Ransom Center honors literary and visual creatives and how they work. Discover White House artifacts and memorabilia at the LBJ Presidential Library & Museum. The Blanton Museum of Art collection spans nearly 3,000 years of history. Outside, the Butler Sound Gallery loops audio of Texas sounds, like Austin's famous bats. See a T. rex skeleton at the





recently renovated **Texas Science** & **Natural History Museum**.

The Neill-Cochran House Museum contextualizes 19th-century life, with a main house and the intact quarters of formerly enslaved people. The castle-like Elisabet Ney Museum presents this remarkable sculptor's work in her former studio. At the Bullock Texas State History Museum, learn about the Lone Star State through hands-on exhibits and high-tech shows.

#### **SHOPPING**

Find retro treasures at **Room Service Vintage**, like housewares and mid-century furniture. Upgrade your closet at **Blue Velvet**, with vintage men's and women's styles.

**Monkies Vintage and Thrift** is effortlessly cool, with old band

and sports tees. Shop for original housewares and gifts from hundreds of Texas vendors at **Atown**.

Flip through new and used vinyl at **Breakaway Records**, from classic jazz to progressive rock. **Black Pearl Books** boosts underrepresented communities through books by and about diverse voices.

Life is brie-zy with **Antonelli's Cheese Shop**'s curated selection of specialty cheeses. Get your fill with a tasting at their **Cheese House** event space.

Set the vibe with candles from Slow North, made with natural botanicals. And develop your green thumb at Succulent Native, selling plants galore.

Three businesses are housed in a refurbished mid-century post office. Grab organic produce at **Tiny Grocer** before sitting down for traditional ratatouille at French bistro **Bureau de Poste**. Independent bookstore **First Light Books** offers coffee, pastries and wine to accompany your read.

#### **INSIDER TIP**

Austin Film Society (AFS)
Cinema presents art flicks
you won't find elsewhere.
Look for DIY productions
and small studio releases
that push the boundaries of
modern film at this twoscreen theater.

# EAST AUSTIN

Dynamic and ever-changing, East Austin is one of the city's most exciting neighborhoods. Culture runs deep here among the iconic eateries, diverse bars and historic landmarks.

#### **DINING**

Dessert first! Save room for ice cream sandwiches at **Wolf & Wheat**. Tel Aviv meets Texas at Israeli-inspired eatery **Ezov**. The pizzas are modern but the vibes are pure '80s at **Bambino**.

Southern kitchen **Hoover's Cooking** masters comfort food, like the classic meatloaf. One Don Juan breakfast taco at **Juan in a Million** is plenty.

Texas-style izakaya **Kemuri Tatsu-ya** pairs Asian brisket with saké and shochu. **Sour Duck Market**'s scratch bread and smoked meat elevates their sandwiches.

New American cafe **Launderette** shines in a former laundromat. Try the pit-smoked mutton at **Sam's Bar-B-Que**, established in 1957.

Flavorful fajitas and a beach resort vibe make **Grizzelda's** feel like vacation. At Italian **Intero**, look for handmade pasta and farm-to-table sauces.

Sample coastal Mexican cuisine with the crispy whole fish at **Veracruz** 






Fonda & Bar. Golden empanadas and traditional grilled meats make Buenos Aires Cafe a favorite.

No dairy? No problem. Everything at **Rebel Cheese** is plant-based. **Cuantos Tacos**' authentic Mexico City-style street tacos include buche and longaniza.

Taco truck **Discada** cooks beef, pork and aromatics in a cowboy wok. The tender brisket and specialty sandwiches at **Ia Barbecue** are standouts. Cisco's has been dishing up huevos rancheros and more for 75 years. Neighborhood Italian spot II Brutto does everything in-house, from pasta to limoncello.

The colorful, modern Thai dishes at **Sway** are flavored with spicy chilis and fragrant herbs. The light and airy **Wayback Cafe** is a farm-to-table eatery with classic dishes like airline chicken.

Summery **Pool Burger** grills wagyu burgers and mixes tiki cocktails from a gleaming Airstream trailer next to **Deep Eddy Pool**. On the banks of Lake Austin, **Ski Shores Café** has been serving fried seafood baskets and ice cream treats since 1954.



#### 9. GRUENE

Located within New Braunfels, Gruene is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Browse locally owned shops and dine in the **Gruene Historic District**, nestled on the banks of the Guadalupe River. See live music nightly at **Gruene Hall**, Texas' oldest operating dance hall, built in 1878.



Take a dip in the **Blue Hole Regional Park** swimming hole, fed by the crystal-clear waters of Cypress Creek (swimming reservations are required). See live glassblowing demonstrations and check out the art installations at **Wimberley Glassworks**. Dine


outdoors on Hill Country-inspired cuisine at **The Leaning Pear**. Don't miss **Wimberley Market Days**, the Texas Hill Country's largest outdoor market, held on the first Saturday of the month from March through December, rain or shine.

#### 11. LOCKHART

The Barbecue Capital of Texas is known for legendary barbecue joints like The Original Black's Barbecue, family-run since 1932. The century-old Kreuz Market dishes up smoked sausage and ribs in a cafeteria-like dining room. Open since 1948, Smitty's Market serves meats fresh from the smoker. Women-owned Barbs B Q, open weekends only, was nominated for a 2024 James Beard Award for Best New Restaurant. Spend an afternoon on Lockhart's quaint town square exploring the charming shops, galleries, restaurants and historic theater. Stop into Best Little Wine & Books, a neighborhood wine bar with a cozy book nook.

See the Caldwell County Jail Museum (housed in the former county jail) and the ornate Caldwell County Courthouse.

#### 12. BASTROP

Walk along a nature trail to spy life-size dinosaur statues and dig for fossils at **Dinosaur Park**. Marvel at the beauty of the Lost Pines at **Bastrop State Park**. At **Community Gardens**, order a snack from a food truck or dine in the sports-themed **Heroes Bar and Restaurant**. Enjoy pizza, craft beer and live music on the riverside deck at **Neighbor's Kitchen & Yard**. See a play at the **Bastrop Opera House**, a local landmark since 1889.

#### 13. ROUND TOP

The tiny town of Round Top is a shopper's dream. Head to **Henkel Square Market**, with stores, eateries and galleries like **Humble Donkey Studio** housed in buildings from the mid-1800s. Across the street

is the famed Royers Round Top
Cafe, known for its amazing pies
(available to-go!). Round Top Village
features specialty shops selling
everything from handcrafted jewelry
to American farmhouse antiques.
The Blue Hills at Round Top
antique show is held in fall, winter
and spring, expanding with seven
new pole barns opening in October
2024. Search for vintage treasures
at The Original Round Top
Antiques Fair, held every spring, fall
and winter.

#### 14. MARBLE FALLS

Boat or swim in the calm waters at **Lake Marble Falls**.

Bring your Jeep, motorcycle or ATV and hit the rugged off-road trails at **Hidden Falls Adventure Park**. Enjoy down-home cooking and fresh-baked pie at the **Blue Bonnet Cafe**, a Marble Falls institution.




#### **15. ROUND ROCK**




