- All riders must wear a properly fastened, ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials) approved riding helmet when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds.
- Riding boots with a heel are mandatory for all riders. Formal Show attire is encouraged for all classes

HUNTER/EQUITATION				
Lealine thru 18" classes are limited to green horses/riders in their first year of showing. Horse/rider combination will be required to move up a division once they have received 6 or more first place ribbons in a full division (at least 3 riders)

Walk-Trot Division - Outreach	Open to green horse/rider in their first year of showing. Riders may not cross-enter into any other classes. Riders may be accompanied in the ring by adults with or without a lead.			
Leadline	Open to riders 10 years and younger as of Dec 1, 2025, or any rider with special needs. Riders may be accompanied in the ring by adults with or without a lead.			
Crossrails Division (Fences 12") - Outreach	Open to green horse/rider in their first year of showing. Riders may not cross-enter into any other classes. Group flat classes with walk/trot/canter			
Future Division (Fences 18") - Outreach	Open to green horse/rider in their first year of showing. Riders may not cross-enter into any classes with fences higher than 2'0"			
2'0 Division - Outreach	*Classes may be combined based on number of entries* Riders may not cross-enter into any classes with fences higher than 2'3." Mini Stirrup division is ages 11 & under, Young Stirrup division is ages 12-17, and Silver Strrup division is ages 18 & over. Flower boxes ok. No oxers.			
Pre Children's/Adult 2'3 Hunter Division - Outreach	Open to junior and amateur riders. Riders may not cross-enter into any classes with fences higher than 2'6." No oxers or combinations.			
Children's/Adult 2'6 Hunter Division - Outreach	Open to junior and amateur riders. Riders may not cross-enter into any classes with fences higher than 2'9." May include oxers. No combinations.			
Junior/Adult 2'9 Hunter Division - Outreach	Open to junior and amateur riders. No cross-entry restricions. Oxers and combinations ok.			
Open Hunter 3'0 Division - Outreach	Open to all riders. No cross-entry restricions. Oxers and combinations ok.			
JUMPER				
Crossrails Jumper Division (0.60m/12") - Outreach	Open to green horse/rider in their first year of showing. Riders may not cross-enter into any other jumper classes.			
Green Jumper Division (0.65m/2'0") - Outreach	Riders may not cross-enter into any classes with fences higher than 2'0." Riders will be judged on correct, safe, and effective jumper style riding. No oxers.			
Puddle Jumper Division (0.70m/2'3") - Outreach	Open to junior and amateur riders. Riders may not cross-enter into any classes with fences higher than 2'6. Optimum time will be set by averaging the time of all entries. No oxers or combinations			
Training Jumper Division (0.80m/2'6") - Outreach	Open to junior and amateur riders. Riders may not cross-enter into any classes with fences higher than 2'9." Oxers ok. No combinations.			
Jumper Division (0.90m/2'9") - Outreach	Open to junior and amateur riders. No cross-entry restrictions. Oxers and combinations ok.			
Open Jumper Division (0.95m/3'0") - Outreach	Open to all riders. No cross-entry restrictions. Oxers and combinations ok.			
Open Jumper Division (1.00m/3'3") - Outreach	Open to all riders. No cross-entry restrictions. Oxers and combinations ok.			
Open Jumper Division (1.10m/3'6") - Outreach	Open to all riders. No cross-entry restrictions. Oxers and combinations ok.			
SPECIAL CLASSES				
Simon Says (Flat Class)	This class transforms the classic game "Simon Says" into an equestrian challenge on the flat. Riders must listen carefully to the announcer (Simon.) They will be asked to perform various gaits and maneuvers, such as "walk," "trot," "canter," "reverse," "halt," etc. Competitors must only follow instructions that begin with the phrase "Simon Says." If a rider follows an instruction that does not begin with "Simon Says," they are eliminated from the class. The judge or announcer will add complexity by giving a mix of valid and invalid commands at a quick pace. The last remaining horse and rider combination to correctly follow only Simon's commands wins the class.			
The Apple Race (Flat Class)	This is a fun flat class in which each rider holds an apple under their chin while walking, trotting, changing rein, etc. Once an apple is dropped, the rider comes to the center of the ring. The last rider holding an apple wins.			

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- The safety, enjoyment, and education of our human and horse athletes is of primary importance. AHS asks exhibitors, their trainers, and guests to follow all HPEC & AHS rules.
- By completing an online entry, signing the entry blank, and/or competing in this show or any other AHS show, the owner, rider, trainer, coach, handler, agent, and/or parent or guardian agree to be bound by the HPEC/AHS rules, agree that AHS may use photographs or videos of you and your horse, and agree to be bound by the Waiver of Liability and Assumption of Risk you have signed as part of the entry process. HPEC/AHS and its related parties shall not be responsible for any injury or damage to you, those you are responsible for, your animals and/or property that occurs at the HPEC whether the injury or damage is caused by a third party, HPEC/AHS, or any other person, animal or thing.
- Please take all personal items before leaving the showgrounds. Items left on the show grounds will be kept for a limited time before given away or thrown out.

FACILITY

- · No Alcohol the possession or consumption of alcohol is not allowed
- No Smoking in or near the warm-up arena, show arena, or in or near any building!
- Dogs must be restrained on the Showgrounds
- Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the showgrounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole

discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. Electric Golf Carts WILL NOT be permitted to plug into any electrical outlet on the grounds. Violation will result in the plug or charger being confiscated by show management, and/or a fine if deemed necessary.

- Electrical/Fire Regulations: Electrical installation and connections in the stabling area must meet all state and county codes. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area.
- Damage: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees and/or horses, dogs or other animals to stalls, buildings and other properties on the showgrounds, including third party property and property of other exhibitors, and shall be billed accordingly.

Stalls

- Limited quantity of stalls are available the day of the show on a first come first served basis.
- Reservations for stalls must be made in advance
- All stalls include 2 bags of shavings. Additional shavings are \$11 per bag

Schooling

- Ticketed schooling will be available on Friday, December 12. Hours TBD.
- Schooling in the show arena will be open for a maximum of 15 minutes before each division. All horses in the schooling/warm-up arenas **MUST have a show number attached to the horse or the rider**/handler. Any horse without its correct number will be asked to leave the arena.
- A warm-up arena with fences will be available during the duration of show
- LUNGING IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE SAME AREA IN WHICH HORSES ARE BEING RIDDEN.

DISCIPLINE RULES HUNTERS/EQUITATION

- All hunter classes will be judged on performance and soundness and when indicated, conformation, suitability or manners, an even pace, and jumping style together with faults and way of moving over the course.
- USEF rules will be followed for horse equipment. Conventional hunter tack is required: snaffles, pelhams, cavesson nose bands, and standing martingales. Judges may penalize a horse or pony that competes in unconventional tack. Exception: Wraps or boots are allowed.
- Martingales are prohibited in non-jumping and hunter hack classes
- After 3 refusals, riders will be excused from the arena
- All horses must be serviceably sound.

DISCIPLINE RULES JUMPERS

- Jumpers are scored on penalties incurred between the start line and finish line. In the event of a fall of a Horse and/or Rider at any time from the time the Horse/Rider combination enters the Competition ring, whether or not the signal to start has been given, the combination will not be permitted to start in the round or Class in question. Penalties apply for late falling rails: 1. after crossing the finish line but before leaving the ring, or 2. before the tone sounds for the start of the next round.
- Penalty faults include disobediences, falls, knockdowns (while in the process of jumping an obstacle) and time penalties. No more than one penalty may be scored at each attempt. If an obstacle is knocked down or displaced for any reason other than it was caused by jumping or an attempt to jump, no penalty is incurred.
- **Disobediences include** Refusals, Run-outs, Loss of Forward Movement, and Circling.
- The first fall of horse or rider results in elimination.
- Clear Rounds: Blue ribbons will be awarded to all riders completing a round with no disobediences, falls, knockdowns (while in the process of jumping an obstacle) or time penalties.

- Judged Rounds: Riders will be judged on correct, safe, and effective jumper style riding.
- Optimum Time Rounds: Optimum time will be set by averaging the time of all entries.
- Table II, Sec. 2 (b) First round and first jump-off are scored by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Competitors who go clear in the first round, remain in the ring and upon an audible signal commence the designated jump-off course. A competitor with a clear round may dismount, and with assistance if necessary, adjust tack and/or equipment; however, upon the audible signal to begin their round, the competitor must start within 45 seconds. In case of a fall of a Rider and/or Horse after crossing the finish line of the first round, the Rider/Horse combination may not continue to the jump-off, and will be placed according to their Score in the first round. A competitor who leaves the arena after a clear round (before or after the tone) will be considered to have withdrawn from the jump-off. If there are no clear rounds and a tie exists for first place, the results will be determined by the scores and time from that round.

AWARDS

- Some prizes have been graciously sponsored by Kahoots in San Tan Valley and Greenway Saddlery in Scottsdale.
- Ribbons 1st-6th will be awarded in all classes with special prizes for 1st place
- High Point Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in all divisions with 3 or more riders. Riders must show & be judged in the entire division to be awarded Champion or Reserve Champion

SHOW MANAGEMENT

- Show management reserves the right to cancel, change, combine/split or otherwise change the classes/divisions and/or daily schedule if necessary and/or in the interest of time.
- All decisions of Show Management are final. Show management reserves the right to refuse any entries at its sole discretion
- Judges' decisions are final

- USHJA membership is NOT required to show. Riders and trainers must be a USHJA member (Outreach level, which is free, or higher) BEFORE the show in order for points to count for the USHJA Outreach year-end awards. Riders collect points to redeem at year end for items of their choice such as USHJA logo wear, ribbons, or medallions. Read all about the program on the USHJA website.
- Classes with age restrictions will be based on the age of the rider as of Dec. 1,
 2025.
- Exhibitors are expected to be prompt for their classes. A two minute call will be placed on an open gate.
- Trainers are asked to enter as an unjudged round.
- For the welfare of all horses competing and at the recommendation of USEF judges, the suggested maximum number of classes over fences is 4 and not more than 6 per horse per day will be permitted.
- If show management and/or judges see dangerous riding, 1 warning will be issued. Second occurance will be dismissed from show arena.
- Management reserves the right to remove persons from the showgrounds who Management determines are abusive to their horse or are not acting in the best interest of their horse
