DISCUSSION QUESTIONS August 3, 2025

READ DEUTERONOMY 31:6-8

- 1. What does it mean to you that God "goes before" you?
- 2. Can you think of a time when you felt God's presence before you entered a difficult situation?
- 3. What are some practical ways we can remind ourselves that God is with us, especially when we're afraid or unsure?

READ ISAIAH 41:10

- 4. Why do we sometimes feel pressure to handle things on our own?
- 5. How does this verse challenge the idea that needing help is a sign of weakness?

READ MATTHEW 28:18-20

- 6. How does knowing that Jesus is with us "to the end of the age" affect how we approach trials and decisions today?
- 7. What lies do we sometimes believe when we feel alone, and how can we combat them with the truth.
- 8. Is it okay to be honest with God about our loneliness or doubts? (Consider Psalms, or Martha's words in John 11:21)
- 9. How can the church community support people who feel isolated?
