


ROME

ROME TOURS

Classic Highlights Morning Tour

Visit the classic monuments of Rome with a private guide with this three-hour tour. Start with a pleasant stroll from Piazza della Repubblica's Fountain of Nayads to the historical center's Trevi Fountain, the Column of Marco Aurelio, Bernini-designed Montecitorio Palace, the Pantheon, and Piazza Navona.

The symbol of Rome, the Colosseum, waits for you after a morning spent exploring the Roman Forum and Palatine Hill, all of which neatly recap the history of ancient Rome from the very beginning, over 2,000 years ago. The wonder continues with a visit to St. Peter's Square and Basilica, where you'll view Michelangelo's *Pietà* and Bernini's *Baldachin*.








FLORENCE

World-famous cuisine, accented with virgin pressed olive oil and washed down with the region's celebrated Chianti, rouse taste buds to dance. FLORENCE TOURS

Best of Florence Walking Tour

Begin at one of the most historic piazzas in Florence, Piazza della Repubblica, to arrive at Loggia del Mercato Nuovo for a good luck rub of the Porcellino statue. Learn about this and other local legends with your guide, who will then take you to Ponte Vecchio, Accademia dei Gergofili, Uffuzi Square, Piazza della Signoria, and Piazza San Giovanni, where you'll end beneath the shadow of the cathedral.

Siena, San Gimignano & Chianti with Wine Tasting

Cross the beautiful Chianti hills to the medieval hilltop walls of Monteriggioni and stately architecture of Siena. Refresh yourself with San Gimignano's famous white wine, then drink in views of Vernaccia, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Do some sightseeing on your own along its narrow streets, reconvene over included gelato, then melt back into the postcard-perfect landscape of Chianti.

Half-Day Pisa Tour

Journey through the sunny countryside in a Mercedes to walk around Piazza dei Miracoli, where the city's symbol has stood for 840 years ... alongside other historic buildings like the cathedral and Monumental Graveyard, which was partially destroyed during WWII. Another popular stop is Piazza dei Cavalieri's Muda Tower, where Dante's Count Ugolino della Gherardesca and his family were immured.

Pisa, Siena & San Gimignano

Wander a UNESCO World Heritage Site, medieval towns, and unforgettable urban spaces in this all-day comprehensive Tuscan countryside tour. You'll see artistic masterpieces by those such as Ambrogio Lorenzetti and architectural ones like the Collegiata. Experience history through the still-standing 13 towers of San Gimignano, the shell-shaped Piazza del Campo of Siena, Piazza dei Miracoli, and more.

Chianti Colors and Flavors Tour

Fine wine and rolling hills lure visitors away from the city to enjoy relaxing afternoons in the Tuscan countryside. Begin with snacks at a rustic wine estate with home-produced olive oil, then visit Greve, the best-known Chianti-producing village. Walk its alleys and medieval square, visit artisan shops, then finish with another wine tasting with local products and among the olive trees of the estate.





TUSCANY

Tall cypresses stand guard just outside the cities of Tuscany, while red-roofed farmhouses and fields of sunflowers add pops of joyful color. A food-lover's paradise, this region that stretches from the Tyrrhenian Sea to the Apennines is a cornucopia of some of Italy's finest gourmet exports, from fresh olives to perfect rows of grapevines, waiting to be turned into the finest wines. The former breadbasket of the Roman Empire, little in this regard has changed in those thousands of years.

Tuscany's cities remain wonderfully preserved as well, with Florence and Siena remaining the frontrunners as the most-visited cities in the region. All are renowned repositories of visual and culinary art, offering delectable dining, lauded museums, stunning architecture, and elaborate frescoes.


VENICE

Full-Day Capri & Anacapri

If the Amalfi Coast is the business, then Capri is show business. A magnet for celebs since the days of Roman emperors, it's an easy ferry then minibus ride to the cobbled alleys and jaw-dropping views of Anacapri on the west side, where you'll get free time before arriving in Capri town for a walking tour. View the Faraglioni rocks from the Gardens of Augustus; don't miss the many baroque churches.

Herculaneum Morning Tour

Like nearby Pompeii, ancient Herculaneum suffered a similar fate from the Vesuvius eruption in 79 AD and has become an open-air history book. Archaeologists have unearthed fossilized furniture, upper wooden floors of houses, mosaics, sculptures, and streets, providing you with incredible insight into the lives of ancient Romans at this UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Ischia & La Mortella Garden

Dominated by Mt. Epomeo, the small, mountainous island of Ischia off the northern tip of the Bay of Naples is a delightful day trip, especially with a hydrofoil crossing, scenic drive, stunning scenery, free time for lunch, and visit to La Mortella Gardens, a lovingly tended subtropical garden featuring over 300 rare and exotic plants, ornate statues, waterfalls, and views over the Bay of Forio.

Pompeii & Herculaneum

Discover two of the world's greatest archeological sites, both UNESCO-listed and both buried by Mt. Vesuvius's most devastating eruption nearly 2,000 years ago. On the streets of Pompeii, learn about the richly decorated villas of the upper classes, its public spaces and temples, and see remnants of both. After lunch, you'll see boathouses, marble floors, and wall paintings at Herculaneum.

Full-Day Capri Cruise

Experience cosmopolitan Capri like the rich and glamorous, leisurely gliding over on a 14-person boat. Pass the rugged beaches of Marciano and Mitigliano, under the cliffs of Capri. In the right conditions, swim before coming ashore at the Marina Grande. With three hours to explore on your own, visit historic churches or chic boutiques and bars. Savor a taste of limoncello on your return sail to Sorrento.

You'll have free time at both to snack, shop, swim, or explore the candy-colored houses tumbling down steep cliffs and crooked lanes packed with cafés and bakeries. Save room for limoncello back on board.

Taste of Naples Full-Day Tour

Dip in and out of old town eateries, bakeries, and markets sampling Neapolitan delights in edible and edifice formats, starting from the historic center and its churches, palaces, and Europe's oldest opera house. The end destination is the Pignasecca street market and Spaccanapoli alley, where you'll munch on *cuoppo di frittura* as an appetizer to the sfogliatella pastry you can opt to end your tour with.







Drive along the Saronic Gulf, stopping by Corinth Canal, to Mycenae, the Homeric city "rich in gold." Visit the Lion's Gate, Cyclopean Walls, and Royal Tombs before breaking for lunch. Depart for Nafplio through the plain of Argolis. Snap shots of the clifftop Palamidi Fortress before leaving for Epidaurus's 4th century BCE theater famous for its acoustics. Return to Athens by coastal road around 7:30 PM.

Delphi Full-Day Tour

Drive through the plain of Beotia, crossing the towns of Thebes, Levadia, and Arachova to arrive at Delphi, the "Navel of Earth." On the slopes of Mt. Parnassus, see the ruins of the Sanctuary of Apollo, famous site of oracles. Visit the Treasury of the Athenians, Temple of Apollo, and its museum's ancient masterpieces. Lunch in the modern village of Delphi and return to Athens by the same route at 7:30 PM.

Day Cruise to Aegina, Poros and

Hydra

Disembark first in Hydra, a favorite for its traditional stone houses and turbulent history. Take two hours to traverse tight stone-paved streets by foot or the island's traditional "vehicle," saddled donkeys, and make your way to the seaside promenade and craft shops before heading to small Poros and large Aegina. There, you can buy tickets for an add-on tour of the Temple of Afea archeological site.





MYKONOS & SANTORINI

Part of the Cyclades chain of the Greek Islands, Mykonos and Santorini are where millions of the country's natives join tourists from around the world to pay tribute to two of the most spectacular views in the world; their whitewashed walls are as iconic as the Acropolis itself.

Mykonos provides a lively counterpart to its quiet, dreamy sister. Nicknamed the "Island of the Winds," surfers, windsurfers, sailors, jet skiers, and scuba divers make the most of sparkling white beaches before cooling off on land. 


MADRID



Ride along a winding road that cuts into the Tramuntana mountain range, then La Calobra and the Torrente de Pareis cliff formation. Travel to Soller's port by boat to catch a tram to the village, then back to Palma in the famous Palma/Soller train through orange groves to return to your resort by coach. Order depends on train journey time.

Jeep Tour

An incredible experience on a route led by guides through the private land of "Finca Massanella," this is a nature-immersive adventure for the (21+) driver and all passengers. Various stops are made to enjoy the mountainous landscape and wildlife, plus one at a country house, where you may purchase lunch and drinks. In this reduced mobility-friendly tour, start from modern capital and maritime hub Santa Cruz de Tenerife and on to La Laguna, Tenerife's first conquest-founded city, to walk its streets. On an air-conditioned bus, ride to Anaga Rural Park, a Biosphere Natural Reserve with a Tertiary Era laurel forest, then ocean-and-cliff hamlet Taganana for free time and lunch. End with a detour to Las Teresitas beach.
