




Fiction



Fantasy: fiction stories that involve strange or other worldly settings and/or characters. These stories often feature magic, superhuman abilities and royalty.

Example: Harry Potter Series


Fairy Tale: Stories with either fairies or magical creatures and characters. This type of fiction is usually a short story is typically written for children.



Example: The Girl Who Drank the Moon


Science Fiction: a story with imaginary and often futuristic elements. It can take place on other planets or futuristic settings. These stories usually involve scientific innovations (technology).

Example: Cinder



Mythology: a story (or group of stories) that belongs to a particular people or culture and tell about their ancestors, heroes, history, gods and other supernatural beings.

Example: The Lightning Thief



Tall Tale: a humorous story that is too far-fetched to be true. Often includes exaggerations and feature well known characters.

Example: The Tall Tale of Paul Bunyan



Folklore: fiction stories that involve songs, myths and proverbs of a group of people or "folk". These stories are handed


down to generations by word of mouth. This story is often about a folk hero.

Horror: This fiction story has events that evoke a feeling of fear or dread in both the characters and the reader.


Historical Fiction: This kind of story is based on an event that actually happened in history, but the characters and their actions are made up.


Mystery: This is a fiction involving a solution of a crime or the discovering of clues and secrets.




Humor: Fiction full of fun, comedy and excitement, written to entertain you.

Biography: A book telling about a real person's life. Everything in the book is true.


