

Reason 1

Brides want to capture that candid and magical moment when the groom sees her on the aisle for the first time with her wedding gown. She wants to capture that tear.

Reality

To ease their concerns, as a photographer, I've seen grooms tear up twice—during the first look and when their brides walk down the aisle.

A first look doesn't take away the aisle magic; it adds another layer of emotional depth to the day.

Even if you get all the tears out during first look... you'll find a secret stash of them during the ceremony, trust me! (A groom on Reddit)





Common Reasons Some Brides Hesitate and My Real-Life Experiences

Reason 2

Brides worry that having a first look will make the ceremony less emotional.

Reality

A first look actually helps to calm nerves, allowing couples to be more present during the ceremony. Many couples have told me they felt more connected and emotionally engaged during their vows after sharing a first look.

I was so nervous at the ceremony with so many people, I feel like the whole thing took like 3 minutes! Doing it privately meant I could take my time admiring him and getting admired. (A bride on Reddit)

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The Dos and Don'ts of a *First Look*

Preparing for your first look is about creating a sacred space
where love unfolds in quiet moments.

And it takes careful planning to achieve that.



Plan the timing and location carefully.

Pick a secluded spot with great lighting for your first look. Natural light works best, as it enhances the beauty of the moment without harsh shadows or overly bright highlights.

If you're unsure about the location, hiring an experienced photographer who knows how to choose the perfect place can ease your worries.

Don't rush the moment.

It is normal to feel time-crunched during your wedding day. After all, there are so many moving parts and it's hard to feel in control of everything and everyone. But think of this moment as solely created for you and your groom. The world can wait.

Take your time to enjoy each other's company and let the emotions flow naturally. Allow yourselves at least 10-15 minutes to connect, embrace, and savor this special time without feeling pressured by the schedule.

Ensure privacy.

This moment should be just for the two of you, away from the hustle and bustle of the day.

Find a quiet corner of your venue or even consider a nearby park or garden where you won't be disturbed.

This allows you to fully immerse yourself in the moment without distractions.

Don't forget personal touches.

Consider exchanging gifts, making private vows, or including any other personal elements.

These little gestures can add profound meaning to your first look, making it a deeply personal and memorable experience.





Communicate your expectations.

Discuss with your photographer and coordinator what you envision for the first look.
