#### RISE AGAINST HUNGER -VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Date: Saturday, October 4, 2025 Time: 10:00 am – 12:00 pm

We are excited to announce our sixth Rise Against Hunger event at Meadows. The event is scheduled for Saturday morning, October 4. We will be packing over 12,500 meals again this year. Meadows has packed over 55,000 meals since the first meal packing event in 2019. In our previous events, between 60 and 70 Meadows members and friends were able to join in Christian fellowship serving God's kingdom by providing meals for those who, as a result of their circumstances, struggle to provide for themselves and their families.

We would ask that you check your calendars and prayerfully consider signing up for this year's event. We would also encourage you to invite your friends as we will be packing a lot of meals. Sign-up for this year's event will be similar to last year as we will not be having two distinct one (1) hour shifts as we have in the past. However, we do want to accommodate members who may only be able to participate for one (1) hour. That said, we will be encouraging members and friends to sign up for the full two (2) hours but will leave open the possibility of time slots of either 10:00 am – 11:00 am or 11:00 am to 12:00 pm.

The meals that we pack are distributed to countries all over the world with each packet providing a nutritious meal for a family of four (4). The meals from last year's packing event were delivered in November 2024 to the Philippines. This is the second year that the meals have been sent to the Philippines. We would be excited to have you join us as we seek to serve God's kingdom during this year's fun-filled event. Jobs are available for people who prefer to be seated, and if you are able to be on your feet for a while, we have jobs for you as well. If you can help with the initial set-up, we would greatly appreciate your help in that way, too. Set-up will begin around 8:30 am.

Thank you for participating in our CROP Hunger Walk! Our Main Walk starts and ends at Westminster Presbyterian Church. However, Teams have the option of selecting their own date and route.

Since 1972, our CROP Walk's mission has been to:

Educate our community about the needs of hungry people in our community and around the world through this service project.

Raise funds to help hungry people survive and become self-reliant. The money is used to restore lives hurt by disasters including famines, floods, wars, and poverty. We raised \$26,793 last year. 75% supports the international relief efforts of Church World Service (CWS). 25% goes to our local Emergency Food Network and Meals on Wheels.

Please request donations from your extended family and friends from church and neighborhood. In addition to face-to-face discussions, consider requesting donations through mail, e-mail or using social media. Checks should be made payable to CWS/CROP. Donation Envelopes are available from your Team Leader. Please also consider registering on-line at the web address listed above. When registering you can join a Team or be a member of a new Team.

# "Charles' Corner" By Dr. Charles Pickell "For the Living of These Days" (2010)

#### THE SAVING MINORITY

Minorities have been the focus of much concern in recent years—ethnic minorities, religious minorities, gender minorities, their rights, their acceptance by others, their assimilation into society.

One minority that is rarely mentioned but which is prominent in the Bible is the saving minority, people who ask no privilege, go against the tide, yet have an impact beyond measure.

Throughout history, God has used minorities, people of faith, commitment, integrity, vision, to accomplish his purposes.

Abraham is representative of such people. When God announced that Sodom and Gomorrah would be destroyed because of their decadence, Abraham interceded for them and received the promise that if ten righteous people could be found there, the cities would be spared.

Ten couldn't be found!

Still it is clear that a few dedicated, Godly people could have exerted an influence far beyond their numbers and saved the day.

God has always worked through the few: Noah was in the minority when he built the Ark.

Abraham stood alone when, at God's command, he took his family and left Ur "not knowing where he was going."

Moses was a party of one when he received the Commandments and when he led the Exodus.

The Hebrew prophets were a minority calling people back to God.

The disciples were a minority in their devotion to Jesus.

The early church was a minority in an alien culture.

The Reformers were a minority opposing the entrenched power of the church.

The settlers of American independence were a minority searching for a better life.

The framers of the American independence were a minority opposing an empire.

It bothers me when I hear people speak despairingly of the state of the nation, the church, or the world as if they were impotent, unable to do anything about it. But to resign oneself to impotence is to ignore history and is a failure in confidence in God who has always used saving minorities as a source of renewal, salt in time of decay, light in darkness, hope in the midst of despair.

You may be in the minority, but: "Greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world."
